SENATE BILL 424

1 There is a Class D beer, wine, and liquor license. (a) 2 (b) The Board may: 3 issue the license only to a holder of a Class B (SB) restaurant – service 4 bar beer, wine, and liquor (on-sale) license; or 5 (2)restrict off-sale privileges of the license holder. 6 The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor (c) (1) 7 at retail at the place described in the license for on- and off-premises consumption. 8 The area of the licensed premises normally used to prepare and 9 consume food and alcoholic beverages on the premises may occupy not less than 80% of the square foot area, unless the license holder has held the license since before December 31, 10 11 1966. 12 (d) The license may not be issued for use by a drugstore. 13 (e) The annual license fee is \$1,500. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 14
