A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to exempt from the foreign insurer excise tax certain insurance policies issued by United States territory and possession insurers.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Puerto Rico Insurance
- 5 Excise Tax Exemption Act of 2019".

1	SEC. 2. CERTAIN INSURANCE POLICIES ISSUED BY UNITED
2	STATES TERRITORY AND POSSESSION INSUR-
3	ERS EXEMPT FROM FOREIGN INSURER EX-
4	CISE TAX.
5	(a) In General.—Section 4373 of the Internal Rev-
6	enue Code of 1986 is amended by adding at the end the
7	following new paragraph:
8	"(3) Territories and possessions.—Any
9	policy of insurance, indemnity bond, annuity con-
10	tract, or policy of reinsurance issued by a partner-
11	ship or corporation created or organized under the
12	laws of any territory or possession of the United
13	States, unless any of the hazards, risks, losses, or li-
14	abilities covered thereby are covered by a policy of
15	reinsurance issued by a foreign insurer or reinsurer
16	(other than such a partnership or corporation).".
17	(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
18	this section shall apply to premiums paid after the date
19	of the enactment of this Act.
