A BILL

To provide for the establishment of a section of the website of the Department of Commerce that shall serve as the primary hub for information relating to Federal manufacturing programs, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

23	(d) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
24	are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary such
25	sums as may be necessary to carry out this section.

1	(B) the Federal manufacturing programs
2	described in paragraph (1); and
3	(C) any other manufacturing-related chal-
4	lenges experienced by manufacturers in the
5	$United\ States;$
6	(4) establish web pages within the hub that shall
7	focus on—
8	(A) technology and research and develop-
9	ment;
10	(B) trade;
11	(C) workforce development and training;
12	(D) industrial commons and supply chains;
13	and
14	(E) small and medium manufacturers; and
15	(5) use machine learning to—
16	(A) identify frequently asked questions; and
17	(B) disseminate to the public answers to the
18	questions identified under subparagraph (A).
19	(d) No Additional funds are
20	authorized to be appropriated for the purpose of carrying
21	out this section. The Secretary shall carry out this section
22	using amounts otherwise available to the Secretary for such
23	purposes.

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
