(3) in section 137, by striking "\$22,080,000" 1 2 and inserting "\$44,838,000" and by striking 3 "\$2,261,000" and inserting "\$4,547,000"; and 4 (4) by adding after section 157 the following 5 new sections: 6 "Sec. 158. 10	by the Department of Defense.
11	MILITARY PERSONNEL, NAVY
12	For an additional amount for "Military Personnel,
13	Navy", \$7,000,000, to remain available until September
14	30, 2022, for support of Operation Allies Welcome by the
15	Department of Defense.
16	MILITARY PERSONNEL, MARINE CORPS
17	For an additional amount for "Military Personnel,
18	Marine Corps", \$32,000,000, to remain available until
19	September 30, 2022, for support of Operation Allies Wel-
20	come by the Department of Defense.

7 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE

- 8 SEC. 1101. Not later than 30 days after the date of
- 9 enactment of this Act, and every 30 days thereafter
- 10 through fiscal year 2022, the Secretary of Defense shall
- 11 provide a written report to the congressional defense com-
- 12 mittees describing the execution of funds provided in this
- 13 title, including the amounts obligated and expended, in
- 14 total and since the previous report; the nature of the costs
- 15 incurred or services provided by such funds; and any reim-
- 16 bursements or funds transferred by another Federal agen-
- 17 cy to the Department of Defense which relates to the pur-
- 18 pose of the funds provided by this title.
- 19 Sec. 1102. Notwithstanding any other provision of
- 20 law, funds provided by this title shall only be for the pur-
- 21 poses specified, and shall not be subject to any transfer
- 22 authority provided by law.

16	For an additional amount for "Refugee and Entrant
17	Assistance", \$1,263,728,000, to remain available until
18	September 30, 2023, for support of Operation Allies Wel-

20	tivities in support of citizens or nationals of Afghanistan
21	paroled into the United States under section 212(d)(5) of

- 19 for fiscal year 2022.
- 20 Sec. 1504. Each amount provided by this division is
- 21 designated by the Congress as being for an emergency re-
- 22 quirement pursuant to section 4001(a)(1) and section
- 23 4001(b) of S. Con. Res. 14 (117th Congress), the concur-

2	rector of the Office of Management and Budget shall pro-

6	describe the strategy and transition plan leading to the
7	conclusion of Operation Allies Welcome; a plan, including
