A BILL

To require the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration to evaluate and consider revising regulations relating to emergency medical equipment requirements for passenger aircraft.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Airplane Kids In Tran-
- 5 sit Safety Act of 2017" or the "Airplane KITS Act".

SEC. 2. EMERGENCY MEDICAL EQUIPMENT ON PASSENGER

- 2 AIRCRAFT.
- 3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the
- 4 date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of
- 5 the Federal Aviation Administration shall evaluate and re-
- 6 vise, as appropriate, the regulations under part 121 of title
- 7 14, Code of Federal Regulations, regarding the emergency
- 8 medical equipment requirements, including the contents of
- 9 first-aid kits, applicable to all certificate holders operating
- 10 passenger aircraft under that part.
- 11 (b) Considerations.—In carrying out subsection
- 12 (a), the Administrator shall consider whether the min-
- 13 imum contents of approved emergency medical kits, in-
- 14 cluding approved first-aid kits, include appropriate medi-
- 15 cations and equipment to meet the emergency medical
- 16 needs of children.

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
