A BILL

To amend the Fair Credit Reporting Act to delay the inclusion in consumer credit reports and to establish requirements for debt collectors with respect to medical debt information of veterans due to inappropriate or delayed billing payments or reimbursements from the Department of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Protecting Veterans
- 3 Credit Act of 2017".
- 4 SEC. 2. PURPOSE.
- 5 The purposes of this Act are—
- 6 (1) to rectify problematic reporting of medical
- 7 debt included in a consumer report of a veteran due
- 8 to inappropriate or delayed payment for hospital
- 9 care or medical services provided in a non-Depart-
- ment of Veterans Affairs facility under the laws ad-
- ministered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs; and
- 12 (2) to clarify the process of debt collection for
- such medical debt.
- 14 SEC. 3. AMENDMENTS TO FAIR CREDIT REPORTING ACT.
- 15 (a) Veteran's Medical Debt Defined.—Section
- 16 603 of the Fair Credit Reporting Act (15 U.S.C. 1681a)
- 17 is amended by adding at the end the following:
- 18 "(z) Veteran.—The term 'veteran' has the meaning
- 19 given the term in section 101 of title 38, United States
- 20 Code.
- 21 "(aa) Veteran's Medical Debt.—The term 'vet-
- 22 eran's medical debt'—
- 23 "(1) means a debt of a veteran arising from
- health care provided in a non-Department of Vet-
- erans Affairs facility under the laws administered by
- 26 the Secretary of Veterans Affairs; and

1	"(2) includes medical debt that the Department
2	of Veterans Affairs has wrongfully charged a vet-
3	eran.".
4	(b) Exclusion for Veteran's Medical Debt.—
5	Section 605(a) of the Fair Credit Reporting Act (15
6	U.S.C. 1681c) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
7	lowing:
8	"(7) Any information related to a veteran's
9	medical debt if the date on which the hospital care
10	or medical services was rendered relating to the debt
11	antedates the report by less than 1 year.
12	"(8) Any information related to a fully paid or
13	settled veteran's medical debt that had been charac-
14	terized as delinquent, charged off, or in collection.".
15	(e) Removal of Veteran's Medical Debt From
16	CONSUMER REPORT.—Section 611 of the Fair Credit Re-
17	porting Act (15 U.S.C. 1681i) is amended—
18	(1) in subsection $(a)(1)(A)$, by inserting "and
19	except as provided in subsection (g)" after "sub-
20	section (f)"; and
21	(2) by adding at the end the following:
22	"(g) Dispute Process for Veteran's Medical
23	Debt.—
24	"(1) IN GENERAL.—With respect to a veteran's
25	medical debt of a consumer, the consumer may sub-

- mit a notice along with proof of liability of the Department of Veterans Affairs for payment of that
 debt or documentation that the Department of Veterans Affairs is in the process of making payment
 for authorized medical services rendered to a consumer reporting agency or a reseller to dispute the
 inclusion of that debt on a consumer report of the
 consumer.
 - "(2) NOTIFICATION TO VETERAN.—The Department of Veterans Affairs shall submit to a veteran a notice that the Department of Veterans Affairs has assumed liability for part or all of a veteran's medical debt.
- 14 "(3) DELETION OFINFORMATION FROM 15 FILE.—If a notice and proof of liability or docu-16 mentation is received under paragraph (1), the con-17 sumer reporting agency shall delete all information 18 relating to the veteran's medical debt from the file 19 of the consumer and notify the furnisher and the 20 consumer of that deletion.".
