#### **A BILL**

To facilitate responsible, informed dispensing of controlled substances and other prescribed medications, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Opioid Prescription
- 5 Verification Act of 2021".
- 6 SEC. 2. MATERIALS FOR TRAINING PHARMACISTS ON CER-
- 7 TAIN CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH A
- 8 PHARMACIST MAY DECLINE TO FILL A PRE-
- 9 SCRIPTION.
- 10 (a) UPDATES TO MATERIALS.—Section 3212(a) of the
- 11 SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Act (21 U.S.C.
- 12 829 note) is amended by striking "Not later than 1 year
- 13 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of
- 14 Health and Human Services, in consultation with the Ad-
- 15 ministrator of the Drug Enforcement Administration, Com-
- 16 missioner of Food and Drugs, Director of the Centers for
- 17 Disease Control and Prevention, and Assistant Secretary
- 18 for Mental Health and Substance Use, shall develop and
- 19 disseminate" and inserting "The Secretary of Health and
- 20 Human Services, in consultation with the Administrator
- 21 of the Drug Enforcement Administration, Commissioner of
- 22 Food and Drugs, Director of the Centers for Disease Control
- 23 and Prevention, and Assistant Secretary for Mental Health
- 24 and Substance Use, shall develop and disseminate not later

than 1 year after the date of enactment of this Act, and update periodically thereafter". 3 (b) MATERIALS INCLUDED.—Section 3212(b) of the SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Act (21 U.S.C. 5 829 note) is amended— 6 (1) by redesignating paragraphs (1) and (2) as paragraphs (2) and (3), respectively; and 7 8 (2) by inserting before paragraph (2), as so re-9 designated, the following new paragraph: "(1) pharmacists on how to verify the identity of 10 11 the patient;". 12 MATERIALS TRAINING PATIENT FORONVerification .—Section 3212 of the SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Act (21 U.S.C. 829 note) is amend-14 15 ed by adding at the end the following new subsection: 16 "(d) Materials for Training on Verification of IDENTITY.—Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment of this subsection, the Secretary of Health and Human 18 19 Services, after seeking stakeholder input in accordance with subsection (c), shall— 20 21 "(1) update the materials developed under sub-22 section (a) to include information for pharmacists on 23 how to verify the identity the patient; and 24 "(2) disseminate, as appropriate, the updated 25 materials.".

4	(a) In General.—Section 392A of the Public Health						
5	Service Act (42 U.S.C. 280b-1) is amended—						
6	(1) by redesignating subsections (c) and (d) as						
7	subsections (d) and (e), respectively; and						
8	(2) by inserting after subsection (b) the following						
9	new subsection:						
10	"(c) Preference.—In determining the amounts of						
11	grants awarded to States under subsections (a) and (b), the						
12	Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention						
13	may give preference to States in accordance with such cri-						
14	teria as the Director may specify and may choose to give						
15	preference to States that—						
16	"(1) maintain a prescription drug monitoring						
17	program;						
18	"(2) require prescribers of controlled substances						
19	in schedule II, III, or IV to issue such prescription						
20	electronically, and make such requirement subject to						
21	exceptions in the cases listed in section 1860D-						
22	4(e)(7)(B) of the Social Security Act; and						
23	"(3) require dispensers of such controlled sub						
24	stances to enter certain information about the pur						
25	chase of such controlled substances into the respective

3	"(A) the National Drug Code or, in the cas

6	"(B) the quantity dispensed;

9	(b) Definitions.—Subsection (d) of section 392A					
10	) the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 280b-1), as rede					
11	ignated by subsection (a)(1), is amended to read as follows:					
12	"(d) Definitions.—In this section:					
13	"(1) Controlled Substance.—The term 'con					
14	trolled substance' has the meaning given that term in					
15	section 102 of the Controlled Substances Act.					
16	"(2) Dispenser.—The term 'dispenser' means a					
17	physician, pharmacist, or other person that dispenses					
18	3 a controlled substance to an ultimate user.					
19	"(3) Indian tribe' has					
20	the meaning given that term in section 4 of the In					
21	dian Self-Determination and Education Assistance
