BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Education 3-2B-01. (a) The Baltimore County Board of Education consists of: (1) Seven nonpartisan elected members;


