- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Montgomery County Department of Transportation, in 5 conjunction with the State Highway Administration, to construct a median divider 6 at certain locations where certain citations are issued for violations recorded by 7 school bus monitoring systems; repealing a prohibition on implementing new speed 8 monitoring systems to enforce speed limits that have been decreased under a certain 9 provision of law; requiring the fines collected as a result of violations enforced by 10 certain new speed monitoring systems to be used to enhance safety at certain 11 locations; and generally relating to speed and school bus monitoring systems in Montgomery County. 12



- 2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 3 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 4 Article Transportation
- 5 **8-663**.
- 6 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY.
- 7 (B) (1) THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF 8 TRANSPORTATION, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE ADMINISTRATION, SHALL
- 9 CONSTRUCT A MEDIAN DIVIDER AT EACH LOCATION ON A STATE HIGHWAY WITH TWO
- 10 OR MORE TRAFFIC LANES IN EACH DIRECTION WHERE, DURING A 12-MONTH
- 11 PERIOD, MORE THAN 1,000 CITATIONS ARE ISSUED BY A SCHOOL BUS MONITORING
- 12 CAMERA UNDER § 21-706.1 OF THIS ARTICLE FOR VEHICLES RECORDED
- 13 APPROACHING A SCHOOL BUS FROM THE OPPOSITE DIRECTION.
- 14 (2) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE
- 15 COST OF CONSTRUCTION FOR ANY MEDIAN DIVIDER CONSTRUCTED UNDER THIS
- 16 SECTION SHALL BE SHARED EQUALLY BETWEEN THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY
- 17 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE ADMINISTRATION.
- 18 (II) IF THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FINES COLLECTED FOR
- 19 CITATIONS DESCRIBED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION AND ISSUED
- 20 FOR VIOLATIONS RECORDED AT A PARTICULAR LOCATION IS INSUFFICIENT TO PAY
- 21 FOR MONTGOMERY COUNTY'S SHARE OF THE COST OF THE REQUIRED MEDIAN
- 22 DIVIDER AT THAT LOCATION, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL PAY THE REMAINING
- 23 **COST.**
- 24 21–803.
- 25 (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraphs (3) and (4) of this subsection, if, on
- the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation, a local authority determines that any
- 27 maximum speed limit specified in this subtitle is greater or less than reasonable or safe
- 28 under existing conditions on any part of a highway in its jurisdiction, it may establish a
- 29 reasonable and safe maximum speed limit for that part of the highway, which may:
- 30 (i) Decrease the limit at an intersection;
- 31 (ii) Increase the limit in an urban district to not more than 50 miles
- 32 per hour;
- 33 (iii) Decrease the limit in an urban district; or



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- 1 any funds that exceed 10% of the total revenues to the Comptroller.
- 2 The Comptroller shall deposit any money remitted under 3 this subparagraph to the General Fund of the State.
- 4 (iii) The fines collected by Prince George's County as a result of 5 violations enforced by speed monitoring systems on Maryland Route 210 shall be remitted 6 to the Comptroller for distribution to the State Highway Administration to be used solely 7 to assist in covering the costs of:
- 8 1. Examining the engineering, infrastructure, and other 9 relevant factors that may contribute to safety issues on Maryland Route 210 in Prince 10 George's County;
- 11 2. Reporting its findings and recommendations on any solutions to these safety issues; and
- 13 3. Implementing any solutions to these safety issues.
- 14 (iv) 1. From the fines collected by Baltimore City as a result of 15 violations enforced by speed monitoring systems on Interstate 83, any balance remaining 16 after the allocation of fines under subparagraph (i)1 of this paragraph shall be remitted to 17 the Comptroller for distribution to the Baltimore City Department of Transportation to be 18 used solely to assist in covering the cost of roadway improvements on Interstate 83 in 19 Baltimore City.
- 20 2. Fines remitted to the Baltimore City Department of Transportation under subparagraph (iv)1 of this paragraph are supplemental to and are not intended to take the place of funding that would otherwise be appropriated for uses described under subparagraph (iv)1 of this paragraph.
- 24From the fines collected by Anne Arundel County as a result of 25violations enforced by speed monitoring systems on Maryland Route 175 (Jessup Road) between the Maryland Route 175/295 interchange and the Anne Arundel County-Howard 26County line, any balance remaining after the allocation of fines under subparagraph (i)1 of 27 28 this paragraph shall be remitted to the Comptroller for distribution to the State Highway 29 Administration to be used solely to assist in covering the cost of speed reduction measures 30 and roadway and pedestrian safety improvements on Maryland Route 175 (Jessup Road) between the Maryland Route 175/295 interchange and the Anne Arundel County-Howard 31 County line. 32
 - (VI) 1. FROM THE FINES COLLECTED BY MONTGOMERY COUNTY AS A RESULT OF VIOLATIONS ENFORCED BY SPEED MONITORING SYSTEMS INSTALLED ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2022, ON ANY PORTION OF A HIGHWAY FOR WHICH THE SPEED LIMIT WAS DECREASED UNDER § 21–803 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE, ANY BALANCE REMAINING AFTER THE ALLOCATION OF

- 1 FINES UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I)1 OF THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL BE USED ONLY TO
- 2 ENHANCE SAFETY AT LOCATIONS IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY AT WHICH HIGH
- 3 NUMBERS OF VIOLATIONS ARE RECORDED BY SPEED MONITORING SYSTEMS, AS
- 4 DETERMINED BY THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.
- 5 2. ANY FUNDS USED IN ACCORDANCE WITH
- 6 SUBSUBPARAGRAPH 1 OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH MAY BE USED ONLY AT THE
- 7 LOCATION OF THE SPEED MONITORING SYSTEM THAT RECORDED THE VIOLATION.

- 9 October 1, 2022.
