1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Health – Rabies Vaccination Information – Submission to Local Agencies**
3 **and Use for Licensing**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring, under certain circumstances, a licensed veterinarian who
5 vaccinates a dog, cat, or ferret against rabies to send to a certain local agency certain
6 rabies vaccination information; requiring the licensed veterinarian to send the
7 information within a certain number of days after a vaccination certificate is
8 completed; establishing a certain penalty; requiring a local agency to forward the
9 information to another local agency under certain circumstances; repealing the
10 prohibition on using information in a rabies vaccination record that a licensed
11 veterinarian keeps to license a dog, cat, or ferret; defining a certain term; and
12 generally relating to rabies vaccination information.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Health – General**

(A) IN THIS SECTION, "LOCAL AGENCY" MEANS THE AGENCY THAT HAS BEEN DESIGNATED BY A LOCAL JURISDICTION AS THE AGENCY THAT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF STATE AND LOCAL ANIMAL LAWS WITHIN THE LOCAL JURISDICTION.

[(a)] (B) A licensed veterinarian who vaccinates a dog, cat, or ferret against rabies:

(1) May select the vaccine to be used;

(2) Shall administer the vaccine in a manner that is consistent with the recommendations of the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians;

(3) Shall issue to the owner of the dog, cat, or ferret a vaccination certificate, on the form that the Department approves; **[and]**

(4) Shall keep a record of the vaccination for a period of 5 years; **AND**

(5) IF REQUESTED BY A LOCAL AGENCY, SHALL SEND TO THE LOCAL AGENCY:

(I) A COPY OF EACH SIGNED AND COMPLETED VACCINATION CERTIFICATE; OR

(II) INFORMATION REGARDING EACH ADMINISTERED VACCINATION USING THE METHOD SPECIFIED BY THE LOCAL AGENCY.

(C) (1) IF THE LICENSED VETERINARIAN IS REQUIRED TO SEND VACCINATION INFORMATION TO A LOCAL AGENCY UNDER SUBSECTION (B)(5) OF THIS SECTION, THE LICENSED VETERINARIAN SHALL SEND THE INFORMATION WITHIN 45 DAYS AFTER A VACCINATION CERTIFICATE IS COMPLETED.

(2) IF A LICENSED VETERINARIAN WILLFULLY FAILS TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A LOCAL AGENCY MAY IMPOSE A CIVIL PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING \$10 FOR EACH VIOLATION.

(D) IF A LOCAL AGENCY IS SENT VACCINATION INFORMATION UNDER SUBSECTION (B)(5) OF THIS SECTION FOR A DOG, CAT, OR FERRET OWNED BY A PERSON WHO RESIDES OR IS LOCATED OUTSIDE THE LOCAL JURISDICTION, THE LOCAL AGENCY SHALL FORWARD THE INFORMATION TO THE LOCAL AGENCY FOR THE OTHER LOCAL JURISDICTION.

1 **[(b)] (E)** The information in the rabies vaccination record that a licensed
2 veterinarian keeps may not be used[:

3 (1) To license the dog, cat, or ferret; or

4 (2) To] **TO** tax the owner of the dog, cat, or ferret.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
6 October 1, 2017.
