6 Any provision of Chapter 1 of Subtitle A of Title 5
7 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, as

1 added by the final rulemaking of the State Superintendent
2 of Education of the District of Columbia issued on Decem-
3 ber 7, 2016, that requires a staff member of a child devel-
4 opment facility to have a degree, a certificate, or a min-
5 imum number of credit hours from an institution of higher
6 education, including sections 164.1, 165.1, 166.1(a),
7 170.2(a), 173.3, 174.2(a), and 174.2(b), shall have no
8 force or effect.

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
