

- 1 (3) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the county board shall grant the school health services program coordinator the authority to carry out the provisions of this subsection.
- 4 (ii) The county board shall consult with a county superintendent 5 before any change in the hiring or termination of personnel in connection with a school 6 health services program.
- 7 (4) The Department of Education shall conduct at least two meetings 8 annually with all school health services program coordinators in the State.
- 9 [(d)] (E) On or before December 1, 2015, and every 5 years thereafter, the Department shall report to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly a summary of the information reported to the State Superintendent during the COMAR certification process.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
