Mr. Daines (for himself, Mr. Peters, Mr. Sheehy, and Ms. Slotkin) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To prohibit the importation of certain minerals from the Russian Federation.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Stop Russian Market
- 5 Manipulation Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN MIN-
- 7 ERALS FROM THE RUSSIAN FEDERATION.
- 8 (a) In General.—Beginning on the date that is 90
- 9 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, no min-

1	eral specified in subsection (b) may be imported into the
2	United States if the mineral is—
3	(1) produced in the Russian Federation or by
4	a Russian entity; or
5	(2) determined to have been exchanged with,
6	swapped for, or otherwise obtained in lieu of a min-
7	eral described in paragraph (1) in a manner de-
8	signed to evade or circumvent the application of this
9	section.
10	(b) Minerals Specified.—The minerals specified
11	in this subsection are the following:
12	(1) Platinum, unwrought or in
13	semimanufactured forms, classified under heading
14	7110 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the
15	United States (in this Act, referred to as the
16	"HTS"), including—
17	(A) palladium;
18	(B) braggite;
19	(C) rhodium; and
20	(D) ruthenium.
21	(2) Nickel classified under heading 2604 of the
22	HTS.
23	(3) Copper, ores and concentrates, classified
24	under heading 2603 of the HTS, including zinc.
25	(c) TERMINATION.—

- (1) IN GENERAL.—The prohibition under sub-1 2 section (a) shall, subject to paragraph (2), terminate 3 on the date that is one year after the President certifies to Congress that the Government of the Russian Federation has ended all hostilities against 5 6 Ukraine. 7 (2) Probationary Period.—If, at any time 8 during the 3-year period after the President submits 9 a certification described in paragraph (1), the Presi-10 dent certifies to Congress that the Government of 11 the Russian Federation has resumed hostilities 12 against Ukraine, the prohibition under subsection 13 (a) shall— 14 (A) resume effect; 15 (B) remain in effect until the President 16 submits to Congress another certification de-17 scribed in paragraph (1); and 18 (C) after the President submits such a cer-19 tification, be subject to resumption as described
- 21 (d) No WAIVER.—Notwithstanding any other provi-22 sion of law, the President may not waive the prohibition 23 under subsection (a).

24 (e) Russian Entity Defined.—In this section, the 25 term "Russian entity" means an entity that is organized
