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Maryland Department of Health - Workgroup Behavioral Health Advisory

Council and the Commission on Behavioral Health Care Treatment and Access
Plan to Implement Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment

Requirements

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health to convene a Behavioral
Health Advisory Council and the Commission on Behavioral Health Care Treatment
and Access, through its workgroup on youth behavioral health, individuals with
developmental disabilities, and individuals with complex behavioral health needs, to
provide recommendations to implement Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic,
and Treatment requirements; and generally relating to a workgroup plan to
implement Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment requirements.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 14 That:

(a) The Maryland Department of Health shall convene a workgroup to implement Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment requirements.

(b) The workgroup shall include the following members:
