17		(c) Certified by the Department of Criminal Justice Training; and
18		(d) Deemed [ A guardian certified] by the Center for School Safety as having met
19		all requirements of this section[ is deemed] to be an authorized individual
20		under KRS 527.070(3)(f) and may be armed with a firearm on school
21		property.
22	(2)	The Center for School Safety shall serve as a facilitator for school districts
23		attempting to employ a guardian.
24	<u>(3)</u>	The use of a guardian in a school shall be a temporary safety option until a
25		school resource officer is acquired or employed by the school district.
26	<u>(4)</u>	Local boards of education may employ as many guardians as the board considers
27		necessary for the safety and security of its schools.

Prior to hiring a guardian, the local board of education shall require the

7	(d)	Has completed and passed background checks as required pursuant to KRS

9		under KRS 510.120, 510.130, 510.140, or 510.148, or a criminal attempt,
10		conspiracy, facilitation, or solicitation to commit any degree of rape, sodomy,

13	(e)	Has passed a medical examination completed by a licensed physician,
14		physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse to determine if he or

17		Law Enforcement Council. A person shall be deemed to have passed a drug
18		screening test if the results of the test are negative for the use of an illegal
19		controlled substance or prescription drug abuse;
20	(g)	Has passed the following examinations administered by the Kentucky Law
21		Enforcement Council:
22		1. A background investigation to determine the person's suitability for the
23		position of guardian;
24		2. A psychological suitability screening to determine the person's
25		suitability to perform guardian duties; and
26		3. A polygraph examination to determine the person's suitability to
27		perform guardian duties;

6	(i)	Has passed the marksmanship qualification requirement for a retired peace
7		officer as specified in KRS 237.140;
8	(j)	Has been honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United States
9		within the five (5) years immediately preceding an initial contract to be a
10		guardian] as evidenced by a Department of Defense form DD 214, or is a
11		retired Kentucky state trooper, retired special or sworn law enforcement
12		officer, [-or] former federal law enforcement officer, or qualified honorably
13		retired elected or appointed peace officer with certification pursuant to the
14		Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act, 18 U.S.C. sec. 926C. Each agency that
15		employed a retired Kentucky state trooper, retired special law enforcement
16		officer, [ or] sworn law enforcement officer, or qualified honorably retired
17		elected or appointed peace officer with certification pursuant to the Law
18		Enforcement Officers Safety Act, 18 U.S.C. sec. 926C shall provide to the
19		retired individual proof of prior employment in a prompt and efficient
20		manner, without charge to the individual; and
21	(k)	Has met any other requirements imposed by the local board of education,
22		which may include but are not limited to a preemployment written
23		examination.
24	<u>(6)</u> [(4)]	Each guardian shall be required to complete annual firearm proficiency testing
25	and	shall meet the standard in the same manner as set forth in KRS 237.140(4)(a) to
26	(c).	
27	<u>(7)</u> [(5)]	Each guardian shall be required to complete the course requirements for
