A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Government – Office of the Correctional Ombudsman – Juvenile Justice**
3 **Monitor – Appointment**

4 FOR the purpose of providing that the Director of Juvenile Justice Monitoring is appointed
5 by the Correctional Ombudsman to serve a certain term; requiring the appointment
6 of the Director of Juvenile Justice Monitoring to be subject to the advice and consent
7 of the Senate under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the Juvenile
8 Justice Monitoring Unit.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – State Government**

23 (a) In this part the following words have the meanings indicated.

24 (i) “Unit” means the Juvenile Justice Monitoring Unit of the Office.

(a) The Unit shall include:

(1) a full-time Director of Juvenile Justice Monitoring; and

(2) staff, including juvenile justice monitors, as provided in the State budget.

(B) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE FULL-TIME DIRECTOR OF JUVENILE JUSTICE MONITORING SHALL:

(I) BE APPOINTED BY THE CORRECTIONAL OMBUDSMAN; AND

(II) SERVE FOR A TERM OF 4 YEARS.

(2) IF THE CORRECTIONAL OMBUDSMAN APPOINTS A FULL-TIME DIRECTOR OF JUVENILE JUSTICE MONITORING WHO HAS PREVIOUSLY SERVED IN THAT ROLE, THE APPOINTMENT SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE.

[(b)] (C) Salaries of the Director and juvenile justice monitors and expenses for rent, equipment, supplies, and general operating expenses necessary for the work of the Unit shall be as provided in the State budget.

[(c)] (D) In cooperation with the Secretary of Budget and Management, the Correctional Ombudsman shall set minimum salaries, qualifications, and standards of training and experience for positions with the Unit.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2025.
