

- 9 **(D)** AN INTELLIGENCE AND INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION EMPLOYEE WHO IS 10 AUTHORIZED TO MAKE ARRESTS UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL:
- 11 (1) MEET THE MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED BY THE 12 MARYLAND POLICE TRAINING AND STANDARDS COMMISSION; AND
