## A BILL

To use grant funds to provide identification kits to certain children, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Child Identi-
- 5 fication Act of 2019".
- 6 SEC. 2. IDENTIFICATION KITS FOR MISSING CHILDREN.
- 7 (a) FINDINGS.—Section 402 of the Juvenile Justice
- 8 and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974 (34 U.S.C.
- 9 11291) is amended—

1	(1) in paragraph (6), by striking "and" at the
2	end;
3	(2) in paragraph (7), by striking the period at
4	the end and inserting a semicolon; and
5	(3) by adding after paragraph (7) the following:
6	"(8) the proactive collection and central storage
7	of comprehensive identification information about in-
8	dividual children by local, State, and Federal law en-
9	forcement agencies is resource intensive; and
10	"(9) the National Child Identification Program,
11	known as 'Safety Blitz'—
12	"(A) is a national community service ini-
13	tiative that has partnered with the Department
14	of Justice, Department of State, Federal Bu-
15	reau of Investigation, local law enforcement
16	agencies, nonprofit organizations, and commu-
17	nity organizations to provide families with an
18	inkless, in-home fingerprint and DNA identi-
19	fication kit, which can be turned over to law en-
20	forcement, by the parent or guardian of a child
21	to provide information on a missing or traf-
22	ficked child; and
23	"(B) promotes the proactive collection and
24	storage of comprehensive identification informa-
25	tion within the home, decentralizing the process

1 for law enforcement agencies that often lack the 2 resources to collect and centrally store vital 3 identification information related to individual children.". 4 5 (b) Grants.—Section 405 of the Juvenile Justice 6 and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974 (34 U.S.C. 7 11294) is amended by— 8 (1) redesignating paragraphs (5), (6), (7), (8), 9 and (9) as paragraphs (6), (7), (8), (9), and (10), 10 respectively; and 11 (2) inserting after paragraph (4) the following: "(5) to provide to local law enforcement, for 12 13 distribution to parents of children who attend kin-14 dergarten or elementary school (as such term is de-15 fined in section 8101 of the Elementary and Sec-16 ondary Education Act of 1965), inkless, in-home fin-
