16	(e) "Eligible project" means any agricultural economic development project or
17	proposal, including an agribusiness or alternative fuels project, that:
18	1. Develops necessary supply chain infrastructure within the
19	Commonwealth;
20	2. Has a significant level of capital investment; and
21	3. Demonstrates a positive economic impact to the selected site location,
22	which may be:
23	a. Quantified by the:
24	i. Number of farming operations impacted for each one
25	thousand dollars (\$1,000) of incentives awarded; or
26	ii. Increase in the volume of product or production for each
27	one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of incentives awarded; or

1			b. Based on econometric analysis provided by a state-funded
2			university within the Commonwealth;
3		<u>(f)</u>	"Farming operation" has the same meaning as in KRS 154.60-040;
4		<u>(g)</u>	"Fund" means the agricultural economic development fund created in
5			subsection (4) of this section; and
6		<u>(h)</u>	"Incentives" means either a:
7			1. Direct grant of moneys;
8			2. Forgivable loan;
9			3. Low-interest revolving loan, of which no more than fifty percent
10			(50%) of the principal of the loan is forgiven within the memorandum
11			of agreement required under subsection (6)(c) of this section; or
12			4. Any combination of the incentives in subparagraphs 1. to 3. of this
13			paragraph in conjunction with another lawfully authorized incentive
14			award scheme;
15			based upon the eligible project meeting certain economic conditions.
16	<u>(2)</u>	The	purposes of this section are to:
17		<u>(a)</u>	Provide incentives for eligible projects;
18		<u>(b)</u>	Encourage the location or expansion of agricultural development in the
19			Commonwealth; and
20		<u>(c)</u>	Advance the public purposes of:
21			1. Improvement in the quality of life for Kentucky citizens;
22			2. Providing an economic stimulus to bolster in-state production of vital
23			sustainable agricultural products and services; and
24			3. Creation of new sources of tax revenues for the support of public
25			services provided by the Commonwealth.
26	<u>(3)</u>	(a)	The agricultural economic development board is hereby established and
27			shall be composed of six (6) members to include:

1		1. The Commissioner of Agriculture or his or her designee, who shall
2		serve as chair; and
3		2. Five (5) members appointed by the Commissioner, with at least one (1)
4		person representing each of the following four (4) agricultural
5		sectors:
6		a. Livestock or poultry;
7		b. Row crops;

24		4. Serve for no more than two (2) consecutive terms; and
25		5. Be removed by the Commissioner for good cause or if a member
26		misses two (2) consecutive meetings without good cause.
27	(c)	Upon the death, resignation, or removal of any member, the vacancy for the

1		unexpired term shall be filled by the Commissioner in the same manner as
2		the original appointment.
3	<u>(d)</u>	The board shall:
4		1. Be attached to the Kentucky Office of Agricultural Policy for
5		administrative purposes;
6		2. Meet:
7		a. Quarterly;
8		b. At the call of the chair; or
9		c. Upon a call of the majority of the members; and
10		3. Not be subject to reorganization under KRS Chapter 12.
11	<u>(e)</u>	A quorum of the board:
12		1. Shall consist of at least three (3) members; and
13		2. Is required for any action to be taken by the board.
14	<u>(f)</u>	The duties of the board shall include:
15		1. Administering the fund created in subsection (4) of this section;
16		2. Working with the department to develop procedures, guidelines, and
17		<u>criteria for:</u>
18		a. Prioritizing eligible projects;
19		b. Determining project awards; and
20		c. Terminating incentives to eligible projects;
21		3. Preparing full meeting reports and maintaining all records and
22		official actions of the board;
23		4. Receiving and reviewing applications from eligible projects;
24		5. Prioritizing eligible projects resulting in the maximum agricultural
25		impact;
26		6. Entering into a memorandum of agreement with an eligible project;
27		7. Approving distributions to eligible projects and monitoring progress of

1	those projects through the distribution process;
2	8. Terminating incentives and recovering previous distributions if the
3	terms of the memorandum of agreement are not met; and
4	9. Preparing and submitting an annual report to the Interim Joint
5	Committee on Appropriations and Revenue beginning no later than
6	November 1, 2025, and no later than each November 1 thereafter until
7	all moneys have been fully distributed and all memorandums of
8	agreement have been completed. The report shall contain cumulative
9	and historical information for each application received, including:
10	a. Information to identify the eligible project, including the:
11	i. Name submitted on the application;
12	ii. County within which the eligible project is or will be
13	located; and
14	iii. Agricultural economic development activity for which the
15	eligible project will develop;
16	b. Dates, including the date the:
17	i. Application was received;
18	ii. Application was denied, if appropriate;
19	iii. Memorandum of agreement was executed;
20	iv. Memorandum of agreement is estimated to be completed;
21	<u>and</u>
22	v. Memorandum of agreement was completed;
23	c. The amount of capital investment that has or will be made by the
24	recipient for the eligible project;
25	d. The estimated economic impact to be achieved from the eligible
26	project;
27	e. Whether the incentive is or will be a:

1		i. Direct grant of moneys and the total amount of the grant;
2		ii. Forgivable loan and the total amount of the forgivable
3		<u>loan;</u>
4		iii. Low-interest revolving loan, the total amount of the loan,
5		and the low-interest rate of the loan; or
6		iv. Combination of the incentives in subparts i. to iii. of this
7		subdivision;
8		f. If the incentive is a low-interest loan, the amount of:
9		i. Principal collected from the inception of the loan to the
10		report date; and
11		ii. Interest collected from the inception of the loan to the
12		<u>report date;</u>
13		g. A list of all funding sources to be utilized by the eligible project;
14		<u>and</u>
15		h. The amount of incentive disbursements that have been made to
16		the eligible project under this section.
17	(4) (a)	The agricultural economic development fund is hereby created as a
18		revolving account within the State Treasury to be administered by the
19		<u>department.</u>
20	<u>(b)</u>	The fund shall consist of moneys received from repayment of low-interest
21		loans awarded as an incentive under this section, state appropriations, gifts,
22		grants, federal funds, and any returned moneys required under subsection
23		(6)(j) of this section.
24	<u>(c)</u>	Amounts deposited in the fund shall be used as provided in this section.
25	<u>(d)</u>	Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, fund amounts not expended at the close of a
26		fiscal year shall not lapse but shall be carried forward into the next fiscal
27		<u>year.</u>

1	<u>(e)</u>	All interest earnings of the fund shall become a part of the fund and shall
2		not lapse.
3	<u>(f)</u>	Up to twenty percent (20%) of moneys appropriated to the fund during a
4		fiscal year may be used for eligible projects to retain or create innovative or
5		high-technology jobs in the agriculture industry that are directly associated
6		with developing more diverse energy sources within the Commonwealth.
7	(5) (a)	By working in conjunction and coordination with the Cabinet for Economic
8		Development, the department shall create a program to encourage projects
9		promoting economic development related to agriculture, including:
10		1. Agricultural economic development projects across the
11		<u>Commonwealth;</u>
12		2. Agribusiness projects; and
13		3. Alternative fuels projects.
14	<u>(b)</u>	The Cabinet for Economic Development shall coordinate with and seek
15		guidance from the Commissioner of Agriculture in considering any projects
16		for economic incentives related to agricultural economic development,
17		agribusiness, or production facilities for alternative fuels, including
18		sustainable aviation fuels.

11	2. Only allow the incentives to be applied to costs incurred after
12	preliminary approval.
13	(d) Upon preliminary approval, the business may undertake and begin the
14	project according to the memorandum of agreement.
15	(e) The eligible project shall submit any documentation required by the board
16	upon request.
17	(f) Upon preliminary approval, the board shall:
18	1. Post the company's name, location of the agricultural economic
19	development project, and incentives that have been preliminarily
20	approved on the department's website; and
21	2. Monitor each eligible project to ensure that incentives are distributed
22	incrementally as the capital investment targets are incrementally
23	achieved according to the memorandum of agreement.
24	(g) Records relating to applications for incentives from the fund or under KRS
25	Chapter 154, including exchanges of information and offers, that are
26	denied, or are not otherwise awarded an incentive, shall remain
27	confidential, shall not be subject to public inspection, and shall not be

1			considered public records under KRS 61.870 to 61.884.
2		<u>(h)</u>	1. To obtain final approval, the eligible project shall submit
3			documentation required by the board to confirm that the requirements
4			established by the memorandum of agreement have been met.
5			Documentation shall include information demonstrating that the
6			eligible project has met the minimum capital investment.
7			2. Upon review and confirmation of the documentation, the board may
8			authorize the final distribution of incentives and the memorandum of
9			agreement shall be completed.
10		<u>(i)</u>	The board shall monitor the activities of the eligible project and, based on
11			the documentation provided, confirm that the eligible project is in
12			compliance with the provisions of the memorandum of agreement and,
13			therefore, eligible for the continued distribution of incentives.
14		<u>(i)</u>	If, at any time during the term of the memorandum of agreement, an
15			eligible project becomes ineligible for incentives, the board shall
16			immediately terminate the distribution of incentives and determine whether
17			previously distributed incentives may be recaptured based on a pro rata
18			basis of the partially completed terms and the actual terms within the
19			memorandum of agreement by the benchmarks established in the
20			memorandum of agreement.
21	<u>(7)</u>	(a)	The board shall operate in the same manner as the operation of the
22			Agricultural Development Board in accordance with KRS 248.701 to
23			<u>248.727.</u>
24		<u>(b)</u>	Standards to be used in reviewing and approving an eligible project shall
25			include but not be limited to the:
26			1. Creditworthiness of the eligible company;
27			2. Proposed capital investment to be made;

1		3. Projected tax receipts;
2		4. Support of the local community; and
3		5. Likelihood of the economic success of the agricultural economic
4		development project.
5	<u>(8)</u>	The application shall include:
6		(a) The name of the applicant who will have some relation to the eligible
7		project;
8		(b) A description of the eligible project, including its location and the total
9		capital investment in the eligible project;
10		(c) For eligible projects new to the Commonwealth:
11		1. Certification by the applicant that the eligible project could reasonably
12		and efficiently locate outside of the Commonwealth and that, without
13		the incentives offered by the board, the eligible project would likely
14		locate outside the Commonwealth; and
15		2. The identification of at least one (1) viable out-of-state location for the
16		eligible project;
17		(d) For eligible projects with an existing location in the Commonwealth
18		considering an expansion, certification that the incentives are necessary for
19		the expansion to occur;
20		(e) A letter of support from a local governmental entity in the city or county
21		where the eligible project will be located; and
22		(f) Any other information the board may require.

- (b) Presents, through the medium of youth organizations such as 4-H clubs, Future Farmers of America, and other similar organizations, an educational program concerning the production and marketing of the livestock, poultry, and horse industries;
 - (c) Complies with all administrative regulations which the Department of Agriculture is hereby authorized to promulgate; and

 - (6) Any fair receiving a grant of state funds shall file with the director of the <u>Livestock</u>[Shows and Fairs] Division in the Department of Agriculture, by December 1 of the year in which the grant is received, satisfactory proof that all state premium awards have been paid and a certified notarized financial report submitted by the treasurer of the local fair association.

→ Section 6. Whereas farm families throughout the Commonwealth depend on the expansion and success of a flourishing agricultural industry, and it is imperative that productive farm land in the Commonwealth be preserved and increased and new infrastructure improvements be made, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its passage and approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law.

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
