15	SECTION $\frac{2}{3}$. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
16	October 1, 2025. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of September
17	30, 2028, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be
18	abrogated and of no further force and effect.
