AN ACT

To amend the Peace Corps Act to reauthorize the Peace Corps, better support current and returned volunteers, and for other purposes.

- Subsection (d) of section 5 of the Peace Corps Act

- 17 is amended to read as follows:
- (d)(1) Volunteers and trainees shall receive such
- 19 health care (including, if necessary, for volunteers and
- 20 trainees, services under section 8B) during their service,
- 21 as the Director of the Peace Corps may determine to be
- 22 necessary or appropriate.
- 23 "(2) Applicants for enrollment shall receive such
- 24 health examinations preparatory to their service, appli-
- 25 cants for enrollment who have accepted an invitation to

- 1 begin a period of training under section 8(a) shall receive,
- 2 preparatory to their service, such immunization, dental
- 3 care, and information on prescription options and poten-
- 4 tial interactions, as necessary and appropriate and in ac-
- 5 cordance with subsection (e).
- 6 "(3) Returned volunteers shall receive such health ex-
- 7 aminations within six months after termination of their
- 8 service, including services provided in accordance with sec-
- 9 tion 8B (except that the six-month limitation shall not
- 10 apply in the case of such services).
- 11 "(4) Subject to such conditions as the President may
- 12 prescribe, such health care may be provided in any facility
- 13 of any agency of the United States Government, and in
- 14 such cases the appropriation for maintaining and oper-
- 15 ating such facility shall be reimbursed from appropriations
- 16 available under this Act. Health care may not be provided
- 17 under this subsection in a manner inconsistent with the
- 18 Assisted Suicide Funding Restriction Act of 1997 (Public
- 19 Law 105–12).
- 20 "(5) Returned volunteers, including those whose pe-
- 21 riod of service is subject to early termination as the result
- 22 of an emergency, shall receive upon termination of their
- 23 service with the Peace Corps two months of short-term
- 24 non-service-related health insurance for transition and
- 25 travel (SHIFTT), to provide coverage for a 60-day period

- 1 within which such volunteer will be advised to obtain quali-
- 2 fying health insurance, and an opportunity to extend for
- 3 an additional 1 month such SHIFTT insurance, at the
- 4 expense of such volunteer.
- 5 "(6) Not later than 30 days before the date on which
- 6 the period of service of a volunteer or trainee terminates,
- 7 or 30 days after the date of such termination if such ter-
- 8 mination is the result of an emergency, the Director of
- 9 the Peace Corps, in consultation with the Secretary of
- 10 Health and Human Services, shall provide detailed infor-
- 11 mation to such volunteer or trainee on options for health
- 12 care after termination other than health care provided by
- 13 the Peace Corps, including—
- 14 "(A) where additional, detailed information, in-
- cluding on the application process and eligibility re-
- 16 quirements for medical assistance through State
- plans under title XIX of the Social Security Act (or
- waiver of State plans), may be obtained, including
- through external health care 'navigators' or health
- 20 care option identification services available within
- 21 the public and private sectors;
- 22 "(B) where detailed information on qualified
- health plans may be obtained, including through ex-
- ternal health care 'navigators' or health care option

| 3 | "(C) if such volunteer or trainee is 25 years of |

- 22 "(a) Declaration of Policy.—Congress declares
- 23 that the Peace Corps has a demonstrated ability to deliver
- 24 information, training, and technical assistance virtually

- 1 through the internet and other electronic means to com-
- 2 munities abroad.
- 3 "(b) AUTHORITY.—The Director of the Peace Corps
- 4 is authorized to recruit individuals, who may be located
- 5 within the United States or third countries, to provide
- 6 services virtually by electronic means to communities in
- 7 host countries to flexibly meet the expressed needs of those
- 8 countries.
- 9 "(c) Administrative Provisions.—The Director of
- 10 the Peace Corps—
- 11 "(1) may recruit, train, and accept, on such
- terms and conditions as the Director may determine
- 13 necessary or appropriate, the services of individuals,
- especially those individuals who face barriers to serv-
- ing physically in a host country, who shall serve on
- 16 a part-time basis as virtual service volunteers to
- meet the expressed needs of host countries, such as
- 18 information, training, and technical assistance,
- through the internet or other electronic or virtual
- 20 means; and
- 21 "(2) may provide for incidental expenses of
- such individuals, as determined by the Director to be
- appropriate for the nature of the assignments.
- 24 "(d) Individuals Not to Be Considered Volun-
- 25 TEERS.—An individual who provides services under the

- 1 authority of this section shall not be considered to be a
- 2 volunteer for purposes of section 5 unless the Director of
- 3 the Peace Corps requires the individual to physically serve
- 4 in the host country on a temporary basis.
- 5 "(e) Individuals Not to Be Considered Fed-
- 6 ERAL EMPLOYEES.—An individual who provides services
- 7 under the authority of this section shall not be considered
- 8 a Federal employee except for the purposes described in
- 9 section 5(h).".

"(i) Any Peace Corps employee, including an employee of the Office of Inspector General.
