WHEREAS, The orange crush cocktail originated in 1995 at the Harborside Bar and Grill in Ocean City, Maryland; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section(s) 7–313 through 7–319 of Article – General Provisions of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7–314 through 7–320, respectively.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – General Provisions

7–313.

THE ORIGINAL MARYLAND ORANGE CRUSH IS THE STATE COCKTAIL.
