Mr. MARSHALL (for himself, Ms. JENKINS of Kansas, Mr. YODER, Mr. MCNERNEY, Mr. MACARTHUR, Mr. NOLAN, and Ms. MOORE) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To designate a National Memorial to Fallen Educators at the National Teachers Hall of Fame in Emporia, Kansas.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “National Memorial to
5 Fallen Educators Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 Congress finds that—

8 (1) from 1764 to the date of enactment of this
9 Act, more than 119 educators from 36 States have

1 lost their lives in the United States while performing
2 professional duties;

3 (2) the United States lacks a national memorial
4 dedicated to fallen educators; and

5 (3) a memorial to fallen educators at the Na-
6 tional Teachers Hall of Fame in Emporia, Kansas—

7 (A) was dedicated on June 12, 2014; and

8 (B) will honor educators who have lost
9 their lives in the line of professional service.

10 **SEC. 3. DESIGNATION.**

11 (a) IN GENERAL.—The memorial to fallen educators
12 located at the National Teachers Hall of Fame in Empo-
13 ria, Kansas, is designated as the “National Memorial to
14 Fallen Educators”.

15 (b) EFFECT OF DESIGNATION.—The national memo-
16 rial designated by this section is not a unit of the National
17 Park System and the designation of the National Memo-
18 rial to Fallen Educators shall not require or permit Fed-
19 eral funds to be expended for any purpose related to that
20 national memorial.

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
