Mr. Vela (for himself, Mr. Thompson of Mississippi, and Mr. Katko) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Homeland Security

## A BILL

To authorize certain counter terrorist networks activities of U.S. Customs and Border Protection, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Counter Terrorist Net-
- 5 work Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. DUTY TO COUNTER TERRORIST NETWORKS; DE-
- 7 TAILS AND ASSIGNMENT.
- 8 Section 411 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002
- 9 (6 U.S.C. 211) is amended—
- 10 (1) in subsection (g)(4)—

1	(A) in subparagraph (C)—
2	(i) in clause (vi), by striking "and" at
3	the end;
4	(ii) by redesignating clause (vii) as
5	clause (viii); and
6	(iii) by inserting after clause (vi) the
7	following new clause:
8	"(vii) collaborate with appropriate
9	agencies, including Federal, State, local,
10	tribal, and international entities, to en-
11	hance border security through operations
12	such as operations that seek to disrupt and
13	dismantle networks, including foreign ter-
14	rorist organizations (as such term is de-
15	scribed in section 219 of the Immigration
16	and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1189)), that
17	pose terrorist or other threats; and";
18	(2) by redesignating subsections (p) through (r)
19	as subsections (q) through (s), respectively; and
20	(3) by inserting after subsection (o) the fol-
21	lowing new subsection:
22	"(p) Assignment of Personnel.—The Commis-
23	sioner may detail or otherwise assign personnel of U.S.
24	Customs and Border Protection to other appropriate agen-
25	cies, including to serve overseas in support of global infor-

- 1 mation sharing partnership operations in furtherance of
- 2 enhancing border security, including by preventing entry
- 3 into the United States by individuals known or suspected
- 4 of being associated with a network, including a foreign ter-
- 5 rorist organization (as such term is described in section
- 6 219 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
- 7 1189)), that poses terrorist or other threats.".

## 8 SEC. 3. BRIEFINGS.

- 9 The Commissioner of U.S. Customs and Border Pro-
- 10 tection shall biannually brief the Committee on Homeland
- 11 Security of the House of Representatives and the Com-
- 12 mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs
- 13 of the Senate regarding activities, during the prior six
- 14 months, in furtherance of clause (vii) of section 411(g)(4)
- 15 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C.
- 16 211(g)(4)), as added by section 2 of this Act. Such brief-
- 17 ings may be provided in a classified setting if the Commis-
- 18 sioner determines such is appropriate.
