3 FOR the purpose of transferring the Maryland Council on Advancement of School-Based 4 Health Centers from the State Department of Education to the Department of 5 Health and Mental Hygiene; requiring the Maryland Community Health Resources 6 Commission to provide staff support for the Council; authorizing the Commission to 7 seek certain assistance to provide additional staffing resources to the Commission 8 and the Council; requiring the Council to report certain findings and 9 recommendations to the Commission on or before a certain date each year; defining 10 a certain term; making conforming changes; and generally relating to the Maryland 11 Council on Advancement of School–Based Health Centers.
