Mobile Laundry for the Homeless Pilot Program – Established

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Mobile Laundry for the Homeless Pilot Program in the 4 Division of Neighborhood Revitalization; providing for the purpose of the Pilot 5 Program; requiring the Division to administer the Pilot Program; requiring the 6 Division to award funds under the Pilot Program through certain grants to establish 7 certain mobile laundry services for the homeless; establishing certain eligibility 8 requirements; authorizing in-kind contributions to be used to meet a certain 9 requirement; requiring the Division to rate positively certain nonprofit organizations 10 in selecting applicants to which grants will be awarded; requiring the Division to establish a certain system of outcome measurement; requiring recipients of a grant 11 12 under the Pilot Program to submit certain information to the Division; requiring the 13 Division to submit to the Department of Housing and Community Development 14 certain information on or before a certain date; requiring the Department to evaluate 15 the effectiveness of the Pilot Program and make a certain recommendation to the 16 Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; defining certain 17 terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Mobile 18 Laundry for the Homeless Pilot Program.

- 4 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 8 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS

- 20 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE PILOT PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO
- 21 NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS TO ESTABLISH OR EXPAND MOBILE LAUNDRY
- 22 SERVICES FOR THE HOMELESS.
- 23 (C) THE DIVISION SHALL ADMINISTER THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 24 (D) THE DIVISION SHALL AWARD FUNDS UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM
- 25 THROUGH A MATCHING GRANT TO ESTABLISH MOBILE LAUNDRY SERVICES FOR THE
- 26 HOMELESS THAT:
- 27 (1) SERVE HOMELESS POPULATIONS THAT LACK ACCESS TO CLEAN
- 28 WATER AND LAUNDRY SERVICES; AND
- 29 (2) INTEGRATE DELIVERY OF LAUNDRY SERVICES WITH OTHER
- 30 SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE APPLICANT.

- 1 (E) (1) TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A GRANT UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM, A 2 NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION MUST:
- 3 (I) HAVE A MISSION THAT INCLUDES SERVICE TO THE 4 HOMELESS; AND
- 5 (II) SECURE CONTRIBUTIONS IN AN AMOUNT OF MONEY OR 6 OTHER CONSIDERATION AT LEAST EQUAL IN VALUE TO HALF THE AMOUNT OF FUNDING SOUGHT UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 8 (2) IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS MAY BE USED TO MEET THE 9 REQUIREMENT OF PARAGRAPH (1)(II) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
- 10 (3) IN SELECTING APPLICANTS TO WHICH GRANTS WILL BE AWARDED UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM, THE DIVISION SHALL POSITIVELY RATE APPLICANTS 12 THAT:
- 13 (I) DEMONSTRATE FISCAL CONTROLS, INCLUDING BY MAKING 14 USE OF MULTIPLE SOURCES OF FUNDING;
- (II) EXHIBIT PROJECT EFFECTIVENESS, INCLUDING BY SHOWING HOW A GRANT AWARDED UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM WILL BE USED TO AUGMENT EXISTING SERVICES TO CREATE SEAMLESS SERVICES FOR THE HOMELESS;
- 19 (III) SHOW PREVIOUS SUCCESSFUL EXPERIENCE 20 ADMINISTERING GRANTS; AND
- 21 (IV) MEET ANY OTHER CRITERIA THE DIVISION CONSIDERS 22 RELEVANT.
- 23 (F) (1) THE DIVISION SHALL ESTABLISH A SYSTEM OF OUTCOME 24 MEASUREMENT TO ASSESS THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 25 (2) A RECIPIENT OF A GRANT UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM SHALL SUBMIT ANY INFORMATION THAT THE DIVISION DETERMINES IS NECESSARY FOR THE SYSTEM OF OUTCOME MEASUREMENT.
- 28 (3) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2022, THE DIVISION SHALL SUBMIT TO THE DEPARTMENT THE OUTCOMES OF THE PILOT PROGRAM MEASURED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- 31 (G) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 15, 2023, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL 32 EVALUATE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM AND MAKE A

- RECOMMENDATION TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF 1 2
 - THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON WHETHER THE
- 3 PILOT PROGRAM SHOULD CONTINUE TO OPERATE.
- 4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of September 5 6 30, 2024, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be 7 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
