 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Cahokia Mounds Mis-
 - 5 sissippian Culture National Historical Park Act".
 - 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
 - 7 In this Act:

1	(1) Historical Park.—The term "historical
2	park" means the Cahokia Mounds Mississippian
3	Culture National Historical Park established by sec-
4	tion 3(a).
5	(2) MAP.—The term "map" means the map en-
6	titled "Cahokia Mounds Mississippian Culture Na-
7	tional Historical Park, Boundary'', numbered
8	CMMC-NHP-107, and dated 05-31-2019.
9	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
10	the Secretary of the Interior.
11	(4) STATES.—The term "States" means the
12	States of Illinois and Missouri.

5	(2) Determination by Secretary.—The his-
6	torical park shall not be established until the date on
7	which the Secretary determines that a sufficient
8	quantity of land, or interests in land, has been ac-
9	quired in accordance with subsection (c) to con-
10	stitute a manageable unit.
11	(3) Notice.—Not later than 30 days after the
12	date on which the Secretary acquires sufficient land
13	under subsection (c) to achieve compliance with
14	paragraph (2), the Secretary shall publish in the
15	Federal Register a notice of the establishment of the
16	historical park.
17	(4) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map shall be
18	on file and available for public inspection in the ap-
19	propriate offices of the National Park Service.
20	(b) BOUNDARY.—The boundary of the historical park
21	shall be the boundary as depicted on the map.
22	(c) Land Acquisition.—
23	(1) In general.—Subject to paragraph (2),
24	the Secretary may acquire land and interests in land
25	within the boundary of the historical park by—

1	(A) donation;
2	(B) purchase from a willing seller with do-
3	nated or appropriated funds; or
4	(C) exchange.
5	(2) Limitation.—Any land owned by the
6	States or a political subdivision of 1 of the States
7	may be acquired only by donation.
8	(d) Administration.—
9	(1) In general.—The Secretary shall admin-
10	ister the historical park in accordance with—
11	(A) this section; and
12	(B) the laws generally applicable to units
13	of the National Park System, including—
14	(i) sections 100101(a), 100751(a),
15	100752, 100753, and 102101 of title 54,
16	United States Code; and
17	(ii) chapters 1003 and 3201 of title
18	54, United States Code.
19	(2) Cooperative agreements.—
20	(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may
21	enter into cooperative agreements with the
22	States and political subdivisions of the States,
23	institutions of higher education, nonprofit orga-
24	nizations, Indian Tribes, and individuals—

1	(i) to identify, interpret, and restore
2	nationally significant historical or cultural
3	and natural resources relating to the life of
4	the Mississippian Culture within the
5	boundaries of the historical park, subject
6	to the condition that such an agreement
7	shall provide for reasonable public access;
8	and
9	(ii) to conduct research relating to the
10	Mississippian Culture.
11	(B) Cost-sharing.—
12	(i) Federal share.—The Federal
13	share of the total cost of any activity car-
14	ried out under this paragraph shall be not
15	more than 50 percent.
16	(ii) Form of non-federal
17	SHARE.—The non-Federal share of the
18	cost of carrying out an activity under this
19	paragraph may be in the form of—
20	(I) in-kind contributions; or
21	(II) goods or services fairly val-
22	ued.
23	(e) General Management Plan.—
24	(1) In general.—Not later than 3 years after
25	the date on which funds are made available to carry

1	out this section, the Secretary shall prepare a gen-
2	eral management plan for the historical park in ac-
3	cordance with section 100502 of title 54, United
4	States Code.
5	(2) Consultation.—In preparing the general
6	management plan under paragraph (1), the Sec-
7	retary shall consult with—
8	(A) the States and political subdivisions of
9	the States;
10	(B) institutions of higher education;
11	(C) nonprofit organizations;
12	(D) Indian Tribes; and
13	(E) other affected individuals and entities,
14	including—
15	(i) the Illinois Department of Natural
16	Resources;
17	(ii) the Osage Tribe; and
18	(iii) the HeartLands Conservancy.
