Election Law - Election Judges - Revisions

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that a county employee who serves as an election judge during 4 hours that the employee is scheduled to work for the county receive certain 5 administrative leave and certain election judge compensation; requiring the State 6 Board of Elections to adopt regulations to standardize and minimize any forms or 7 documentation related to service as an election judge; prohibiting a local board of 8 elections or county government from requiring additional forms or documentation 9 related to service as an election judge in excess of those required in regulations adopted by the State Board; altering the election judges who previously served as an 10 11 election judge with respect to whom certain additional compensation is required to 12 be paid; authorizing a public school student in the State to both earn hours toward 13 the service-learning graduation requirement and receive election judge 14 compensation for service as an election judge; and generally relating to election 15 judges.

26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

Article - Election Law

- 3 (A) THE STATE BOARD SHALL DEVELOP AND PROVIDE TO THE LOCAL BOARDS A MARKETING CAMPAIGN TO RECRUIT INDIVIDUALS TO SERVE AS ELECTION
- 5 JUDGES IN POLLING PLACES IN THE STATE.
- 6 (B) THE MARKETING CAMPAIGN SHALL:
- 7 (1) DISSEMINATE INFORMATION ON THE IMPORTANCE OF ELECTION 8 JUDGES;
- 9 (2) DISSEMINATE INFORMATION ON HOW TO APPLY TO BE AN 10 ELECTION JUDGE, ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS, AND COMPENSATION; AND

- 11 (2) The marketing campaign shall:
- 12 (i) disseminate information on the importance of election judges;
- 13 (ii) disseminate information on how to apply to be an election judge, eligibility requirements, and compensation; and
- 15 (iii) target diverse voter populations, including multilingual 16 individuals.]
- 17 (D) FOR SERVICE AS AN ELECTION JUDGE, A PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENT IN 18 THE STATE MAY BOTH:
- 19 (1) EARN HOURS TOWARD THE SERVICE-LEARNING REQUIREMENT 20 FOR GRADUATION UNDER COMAR 13A.03.02.05; AND
- 21 (2) RECEIVE THE ELECTION JUDGE COMPENSATION UNDER THIS 22 SECTION.
