- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 21 (a) This section applies only in Baltimore County AND FREDERICK COUNTY.
- 22 (b) [Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, an] AN Executive Branch 23 agency may NOT ban or regulate the sale of coffee in conjunction with a career exploration
- 24 and development activity CREATED FOR OR ORGANIZED BY STUDENTS WITH



## 1 INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAMS in a public high school.

- [(c) An Executive Branch agency may not ban or regulate the sale of coffee in conjunction with a career exploration and development activity in a public high school that sold coffee on or before June 30, 2018.]
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 6  $\,$  1, 2023.
