- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- Article Criminal Procedure 16
- 17 6-236.
- THERE IS A JOBS COURT PILOT PROGRAM IN THE DISTRICT COURT 18 (A) 19 SITTING IN BALTIMORE CITY.
- 20 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PILOT PROGRAM IS TO REDUCE RECIDIVISM BY
- 21 OFFERING DEFENDANTS AN OPPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE IN FULL-TIME JOB
- 22 TRAINING AND JOB PLACEMENT PROGRAMS AS A CONDITION OF PROBATION, AN
- 23 ALTERNATIVE TO INCARCERATION, OR A CONDITION OF PRETRIAL RELEASE.

- 1 (C) TO ACCOMPLISH THE PURPOSE OF THE PILOT PROGRAM, THE 2 ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS SHALL DEVELOP A PLAN TO IMPLEMENT 3 AND MONITOR THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- (D) ON OR BEFORE JUNE 30, 2027, THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE BALTIMORE WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARD, SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE OPERATION AND RESULTS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That for fiscal year 2024, the Governor shall include in the annual State budget an appropriation of at least \$500,000 to the Baltimore Workforce Development Board, to be distributed to local workforce investment boards or other nonprofit entities that participate in the pilot program by identifying employers and training programs.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of June 30, 2027, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
