A BILL

To include the State of Florida in the Gulf of Mexico outer Continental Shelf revenue sharing program, to extend the moratorium on oil and gas leasing in certain areas of the Gulf of Mexico, and for other purposes.

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Florida Shores Protec-
5 tion and Fairness Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. INCLUSION OF STATE OF FLORIDA IN GULF OF**
 2 **MEXICO OUTER CONTINENTAL SHELF REV-**
 3 **ENUE SHARING PROGRAM.**

4 Section 102 of the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security
 5 Act of 2006 (43 U.S.C. 1331 note; Public Law 109–432)
 6 is amended by striking paragraph (7) and inserting the
 7 following:

8 “(7) GULF PRODUCING STATE.—The term ‘Gulf
 9 producing State’ means each of the States of Ala-
 10 bama, Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas.”.

11 **SEC. 3. MORATORIUM ON OIL AND GAS LEASING IN CER-**
 12 **TAIN AREAS OF GULF OF MEXICO.**

13 Section 104(a) of the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security
 14 Act of 2006 (43 U.S.C. 1331 note; Public Law 109–432)
 15 is amended in the matter preceding paragraph (1) by
 16 striking “June 30, 2022” and inserting “June 30, 2032”.

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
