AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-102, relative to consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

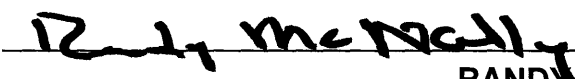
SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-4-102(37)(A)(iv), is amended by deleting the subdivision and substituting instead:

(iv) The facility is located in a municipality or county having a population in excess of three hundred fifty thousand (350,000), according to the 2020 federal census or any subsequent federal census; provided, that a facility located in a county having a population of not less than three hundred sixty-six thousand two hundred (366,200) and not more than three hundred sixty-six thousand three hundred (366,300), according to the 2020 or a subsequent federal census, must not be issued a license after March 1, 2030. The law enforcement agency that has jurisdiction over a sports authority facility located in a county having a population of not less than three hundred sixty-six thousand two hundred (366,200) and not more than three hundred sixty-six thousand three hundred (366,300), according to the 2020 or a subsequent federal census, shall provide an annual report to the general assembly, on or before January 1, detailing any public safety issues related to the facility, including instances of driving under the influence, public intoxication, and vandalism;

SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
