17	WHEREAS, Clayton Baptist Church has proclaimed
18	Sunday, November 21, 2021, as Bill Brown Day and will be
19	honoring Reverend Brown during the morning worship service at
20	11:00 a.m; festivities will follow the morning service with a
21	covered dish luncheon in the Fellowship Hall; Kel Little,

WHEREAS, after graduating from Southwestern, he returned to Clayton to serve as Youth Director and Minister of Music and served for five years prior to taking a pastorate position at Maplesville Baptist Church in 1978, where he served until 1983; and
