## A BILL

To permit occupational therapists to conduct the initial assessment visit and complete the comprehensive assessment under a Medicare home health plan of care for certain rehabilitation cases.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Medicare Home Health
- 5 Flexibility Act of 2017".

| 12 | for an individual who is eligible for home health services   |
| 13 | under title XVIII of the Social Security Act if the referral |
| 14 | order by the physician—                                      |
| 15 | (1) does not include skilled nursing care;                   |
| 16 | (2) includes occupation therapy; and                         |
| 17 | (3) includes physical therapy or speech lan-                 |
| 18 | guage pathology.   |
