8	COMMENDING SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE OF THE HOUSE OF
9	REPRESENTATIVES VICTOR GASTON ON HIS ACCOMPLISHED CAREER OF
10	SERVICE.
11	
12	WHEREAS, on the eve of the conclusion of
13	Representative Victor Gaston's long and storied career of
14	public service, we find it necessary and proper to recount his
15	many accomplishments; and
16	WHEREAS, born in the Union Church community of
17	Mobile County and raised on a family cattle farm that also
18	produced soybeans, cotton, and other commodities, Gaston
19	graduated from Mobile County High School, where he lettered in
20	football and basketball, and was named the area's "Outstanding
21	Student of 1961"; and
22	WHEREAS, Gaston began his career serving as a
23	classroom history teacher at Davidson High School; he earned
24	his Bachelor's Degree from the University of Southern
25	Mississippi; he later earned a Master's Degree in School
26	Administration from the University of South Alabama and a
27	Doctorate of Education from Auburn University; he served as

assistant principal at Adams Middle School and at Satsuma High Schoo, the latter for 18 years, before retiring from public education in 1997; and

WHEREAS, Gaston served his country as a member of the Marine Corps Reserves, where he earned the rank of staff sergeant during a decade-long career; he served an additional 10 years in the Alabama National Guard; he was called to active duty in response to Hurricane Frederic in 1979 and was also deployed for a period in South Korea; and

WHEREAS, after Ronald Reagan carried the 1980 presidential election, Gaston, running as a Republican in a state then bereft of Republicans, won an Alabama State House seat over a well-entrenched Democrat incumbent; after winning the two elections with over three-quarters of the vote, he has run unopposed since 1986; Gaston currently holds the record for the longest unopposed election streak of any state legislator in the South; and

WHEREAS, upon initially taking office, Gaston was one of only 11 Republicans who served in the 140-member Legislature during the 1982-1986 quadrennium; however, that small number included future U.S. Congressman Mo Brooks, future U.S. Ambassador to the Czech Republic Bill Cabaniss, and former Birmingham Mayor George Siebels; and

WHEREAS, in 1987, Speaker of the House Jimmy Clark of Eufaula took note of Gaston's leadership abilities and appointed him to be the only Republican committee chairman in the House of Representatives, heading the House State

Government Committee, one of the four major legislative committees at that time; when Republicans won legislative majority for the first time since Reconstruction in 2010, Gaston was honored with election as Speaker Pro Tempore, the second highest ranking post in the legislative body; and

WHEREAS, elected to his tenth term in 2018, State
Representative Victor Gaston currently remains serving as
Speaker Pro Tempore of the Alabama House of Representatives;
he was elevated to Acting Speaker of the House in June of
2016, and earned widespread praise for restoring faith and
returning stability to that office during a difficult time;
during his tenure as Acting Speaker, Gaston carried out the
body's administrative duties, issued a call for higher ethical
standards among public officials, and, after deciding not to
seek the office himself, presided over the election of the new
Speaker of the House; and

WHEREAS, Gaston's legislative accomplishments include passage of several reform measures that have improved and strengthened Alabama's higher education system, the Historic Rehabilitation Tax Credit that has ignited a wave of urban renewal and historic preservation projects across the state and boosted the economy, a legislative exchange trip to Romania, a gubernatorial trade mission to Chile and Brazil, election as delegate to six Republican National Conventions between 1984 and 2004, membership on the White House Commission on Presidential Scholars of both the Reagan and George H.W. Bush administrations, 12 years of chairmanship of

the Permanent Oil and Gas Study Committee, 8 years of service on the United Sates Energy Council, and current chairmanship of the House Legislative Council and co-chairmanship of the Joint Legislative Council, among a plethora of other accomplishments, too numerous to recount here lest we delay his retirement; and

WHEREAS, perhaps dearest to Gaston's heart are his community service endeavors, including service on the boards of Volunteers of America; Penelope House, a domestic violence shelter; Home of Grace for Women, an alcohol and drug treatment center; AltaPointe, a South Alabama mental health center; SOMI Club, a mental illness outreach organization; the 4-H Club Foundation; the Mobile Area Chamber of Commerce; and the Mobile Association of Retarded Citizens; he serves as deacon of Spring Hill Baptist Church in Mobile, and has participated in 125 consecutive performances of Spring Hill Baptist's renowned "This is Christmas" musical presentation; and

WHEREAS, Gaston freely admits that none of these accomplishments would be possible without the love, support, and constant encouragement of his late wife of 46 years, Jean, whom he met while serving on the Dauphin Way Baptist Church Bus Ministry; together, they had two sons: George, an attorney in Mobile, and Hank, an executive with Hyundai Steel America in Greenville, and six grandsons: Jason, James, Cameron, Matthew, Noah, and Charlie; and

whereas, although Gaston has declared that he will not run for reelection to the House seat he has occupied for decades, this body knows well that his dedication to public service will not end when he crosses the threshold of the State House; rather, the commendations within this resolution are given with the knowledge that he will continue serving his fellow Alabamians and fellow humans for many days; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That State Representative and
longtime Speaker Pro Tempore of the House of Representatives
Victor Gaston is hereby commended for a lifetime of service to
the State of Alabama.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be delivered to Representative Victor Gaston, as a mere token of our immense gratitude and congratulations on the occasion of his retirement.
