10	WHEREAS, there are 8,674 children with disabilities between the ages of 1 and 17 living in commun	nities
11	across Montana; and	
12	WHEREAS, many playgrounds across Montana are not accessible to or usable by children	with
13	disabilities; and	
14	WHEREAS, many communities throughout Montana lack the funding needed to develop acces	sible
15	playgrounds; and	
16	WHEREAS, other federal and private funding sources often require matching funds; and	
17	WHEREAS, a modest state investment will allow communities to leverage limited resources to	allow
18	children and adults of all abilities the opportunity to play together.

20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

22	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriation. (1) There is appropriated \$100,000 for the bien	nium
23	beginning July 1, 2017, from the general fund STATE SPECIAL REVENUE ACCOUNT PROVIDED FOR IN 61-3-321(1	9)(A)
24	FOR STATE PARKS to the department of fish, wildlife, and parks, parks division, to distribute grants to municipa	ılities
25	and school districts to supplement local and private funds in order to secure other grant funding for develop	ping
26	accessible playgrounds that requires a match.	
27	(2) Any state funds distributed must be matched at a rate of 1 to 1, with \$1 in state funds to \$1 in	local
28	funds. A grant may not exceed \$10,000. The department shall ensure that funds are distributed only as neces	ssary
29	to secure other grant funding.	
30	(3) The money must be used to leverage other grant funding that will increase accessibility in exi	sting
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1 playgrounds or for the costs of accessibility features in new playgrounds. The money may not be used during

- 2 initial construction for accessibility features required by the Americans With Disabilities Act for newly constructed
- 3 playgrounds or to upgrade existing restroom or parking facilities that are not compliant with applicable

4 accessibility standards.
