A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Real Property – Contract Liens – Medical Debt**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the creation of a lien on owner–occupied residential
4 property by contract or as a result of a breach of contract for the payment of medical
5 debt; and generally relating to contract liens and medical debt.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Real Property**

19 7–105.1.

20 (a) (8) “Owner–occupied residential property” means residential property in
21 which at least one unit is occupied by an individual who:

22 (i) Has an ownership interest in the property; and

23 (ii) Uses the property as the individual’s primary residence.

2 **(A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS**
3 **INDICATED.**

4 **(2) (I) “MEDICAL DEBT” MEANS DEBT INCURRED DUE TO A**
5 **MEDICATION, PROCEDURE, SERVICE, OR TREATMENT THAT A MEDICAL**
6 **PROFESSIONAL DETERMINES TO BE MEDICALLY NECESSARY.**

7 **(II) “MEDICAL DEBT” DOES NOT INCLUDE DEBT INCURRED DUE**
8 **TO:**

9 **1. COSMETIC PROCEDURES OR SERVICES; OR**

10 **2. A MEDICATION, PROCEDURE, SERVICE, OR**
11 **TREATMENT THAT A MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL HAS NOT DETERMINED TO BE**
12 **MEDICALLY NECESSARY.**

13 **(3) “OWNER–OCCUPIED RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY” HAS THE MEANING**
14 **STATED IN § 7-105.1 OF THIS ARTICLE.**

15 **(B) A LIEN ON OWNER–OCCUPIED RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY MAY NOT BE**
16 **CREATED BY CONTRACT OR AS A RESULT OF A BREACH OF CONTRACT FOR THE**
17 **PAYMENT OF MEDICAL DEBT.**

18 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect**
19 **October 1, 2024.**
