Labor and Employment - Workforce Development - Cybersecurity

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Cybersecurity Workforce Accelerator Program at the University of Maryland Baltimore County to increase the cybersecurity workforce in 4 5 the State, increase the investment of the State in cybersecurity workforce programs 6 and educational programs at certain institutions, and for other purposes related to 7 the cybersecurity workforce in the State; requiring the Department of Commerce and 8 the Maryland Department of Labor to assist in administering the Accelerator 9 Program as necessary; establishing the Cybersecurity Workforce Accelerator Fund; and generally relating to the Cybersecurity Workforce Accelerator and cybersecurity 10 11 workforce programs.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "ACCELERATOR PROGRAM" MEANS THE 22 CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM.
- 23 (B) THERE IS A CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM 24 AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND BALTIMORE COUNTY.



- 1 (C) THE PURPOSES OF THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM ARE TO:
- 2 (1) INCREASE THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS ENTERING THE 3 CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE IN THE STATE;
- 4 (2) DEVELOP A STATEWIDE APPROACH TO CYBERSECURITY
- 5 WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT;
- 6 (3) EXPAND, MARKET, AND INCREASE THE EFFICIENCY OF 7 CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE PROGRAMS IN THE STATE;
- 8 (4) INVEST IN NEW AND INNOVATIVE CYBERSECURITY EDUCATION
- 9 PROGRAMS THAT ALIGN WITH THE STRATEGY OF THE TALENT PIPELINE
- 10 MANAGEMENT INITIATIVE OF THE U.S. CHAMBER OF COMMERCE FOUNDATION;
- 11 AND
- 12 (5) PROVIDE COORDINATION BETWEEN INSTITUTIONS THAT PROVIDE
- 13 ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION AND INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER
- 14 EDUCATION TO PREPARE STUDENTS FOR ENTRANCE INTO THE CYBERSECURITY
- 15 WORKFORCE.
- 16 (D) THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM SHALL:
- 17 (1) WORK WITH MAJOR INDUSTRY CYBERSECURITY ORGANIZATIONS
- 18 TO EXPAND, MARKET, AND COORDINATE EXISTING STATE CYBERSECURITY
- 19 WORKFORCE PROGRAMS;
- 20 (2) WORK WITH THE CYBERSECURITY INDUSTRY TO ENSURE THAT
- 21 STATE CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE PROGRAMS, INCLUDING PROGRAMS IN THE
- 22 DEPARTMENT, ADDRESS THE NEEDS OF THE CYBERSECURITY INDUSTRY;
- 23 (3) PUBLISH A STRATEGY TO FILL OPEN CYBERSECURITY POSITIONS
- 24 BY **2025**;
- 25 (4) WORK WITH THE FEDERAL CYBERCORPS SCHOLARSHIP FOR
- 26 SERVICE PROGRAM TO ADVERTISE CYBERSECURITY POSITIONS THAT ARE
- 27 AVAILABLE AND ASSIST STUDENTS WITH THE APPLICATION PROCESS;
- 28 (5) WORK WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE TO INCREASE
- 29 DEMAND-SIDE PLANNING TO IDENTIFY THE SPECIFIC AND REAL-TIME NEEDS OF
- 30 CYBERSECURITY EMPLOYERS IN THE STATE, INCLUDING BY:

- 1 (I) PROVIDING, AT NO COST, CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE
- 2 DEVELOPMENT SERVICES THAT DETERMINE HOW AN EMPLOYER'S SPECIFIC NEEDS
- 3 CAN BEST BE MET;
- 4 (II) MANAGING THE DEVELOPMENT OF INDIVIDUALS WHO CAN
- 5 MEET CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE NEEDS; AND
- 6 (III) CONDUCTING RESEARCH AND OUTREACH THAT INCLUDES
- 7 PLANNING AND COLLECTING REAL-TIME INDUSTRY DATA TO IDENTIFY
- 8 CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE NEEDS;
- 9 (6) WORK WITH THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO:
- 10 (I) ESTABLISH A SUMMER K-12 TEACHER EXTERNSHIP GRANT
- 11 PROGRAM TO PROVIDE TEACHERS WITH PAID EXTERNSHIPS OVER THE SUMMER TO
- 12 APPRENTICE AT CYBERSECURITY COMPANIES AND PARTICIPATE IN TRAINING
- 13 OPPORTUNITIES AVAILABLE AT FACILITIES THAT PROVIDE CYBERSECURITY RANGE
- 14 TRAINING; AND
- 15 (II) DEVELOP AND INVEST IN EDUCATIONAL AND CAREER
- 16 PATHWAYS IN CYBERSECURITY THAT MEET THE COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS
- 17 STANDARD ADOPTED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION UNDER § 7–205.1 OF
- 18 THE EDUCATION ARTICLE;
- 19 (7) WORK WITH THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF LABOR TO GROW
- 20 THE MARYLAND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT RIGHT NOW FOR CYBERSECURITY
- 21 PROGRAMS AND THE MARYLAND APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING PROGRAM FOR
- 22 CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT;
- 23 (8) PRODUCE, IN CONSULTATION WITH STAKEHOLDERS, A STRATEGIC
- 24 ROADMAP TO FILL AVAILABLE CYBERSECURITY POSITIONS BY CALENDAR YEAR
- 25 **2025**;
- 26 (9) WORK WITH APPROPRIATE PARTNERS TO PROVIDE
- 27 CYBERSECURITY RANGE TRAINING AT ALL LEVELS;
- 28 (10) EXPAND THE MARYLAND TECHNOLOGY INTERNSHIP PROGRAM
- 29 TO INCLUDE UNITS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT; AND
- 30 (11) ADMINISTER THE CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE ACCELERATOR
- 31 **FUND.**

- 1 (E) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "FUND" MEANS THE CYBERSECURITY 2 WORKFORCE ACCELERATOR FUND.
- 3 (2) THERE IS A CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE ACCELERATOR FUND.
- 4 (3) THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO SUPPORT INNOVATIVE 5 APPROACHES TO MEETING CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE NEEDS.
- 6 (4) THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND.
- 7 (5) (I) THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT 8 SUBJECT TO § 7–302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.
- 9 (II) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE FUND 10 SEPARATELY, AND THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND.
- 11 **(6)** THE FUND CONSISTS OF:
- 12 (I) MONEY APPROPRIATED IN THE STATE BUDGET TO THE
- 13 FUND; AND
- 14 (II) ANY OTHER MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE ACCEPTED
- 15 FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FUND.
- 16 (7) THE FUND MAY BE USED ONLY FOR:
- 17 (I) ADMINISTRATION OF THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM; AND
- 18 (II) PROVIDING GRANTS TO ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY
- 19 SCHOOLS, INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION, AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS
- 20 TO OPERATE CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS.
- 21 (8) (I) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST THE MONEY OF THE
- 22 FUND IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED.
- 23 (II) ANY INTEREST EARNINGS OF THE FUND SHALL BE
- 24 CREDITED TO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.
- 25 (9) EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND MAY BE MADE ONLY IN
- 26 ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE BUDGET.

- 1 (10) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024 AND 2025, THE GOVERNOR SHALL
- 2 INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF \$2,000,000 FOR THE
- 3 **FUND.**
- 4 (F) THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
- 5 ASSIST IN ADMINISTERING THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM AS NECESSARY.
- 6 (G) FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR, THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE 7 ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF:
- 8 (1) \$1,000,000 TO THE MARYLAND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT
- 9 RIGHT NOW FOR CYBERSECURITY PROGRAMS AND ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT;
- 10 (2) \$1,000,000 TO THE MARYLAND APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING
- 11 PROGRAM FOR CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT AND
- 12 ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT;
- 13 (3) \$450,000 TO THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND BALTIMORE
- 14 COUNTY TO FUND THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM, INCLUDING \$250,000 TO BE USED
- 15 FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUBSECTION (D)(5)(II) OF THIS SECTION;
- 16 (4) \$2,500,000 TO THE CYBER WARRIOR DIVERSITY PROGRAM;
- 17 (5) \$500,000 TO FUND THE SUMMER K-12 TEACHER EXTERNSHIP
- 18 GRANT PROGRAM REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (D)(6) OF THIS SECTION;
- 19 (6) \$1,000,000 FOR THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF MARYLAND TO
- 20 DEVELOP CYBER RANGE SCENARIOS BASED ON INDUSTRY DEMAND;
- 21 (7) \$500,000 TO FUND EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES ABOUT
- 22 CYBERSECURITY CAREERS IN ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION; AND
- 23 (8) \$500,000 FOR THE MARYLAND TECHNOLOGY INTERNSHIP
- 24 PROGRAM.
- 25 (H) THE APPROPRIATIONS REQUIRED TO BE INCLUDED IN THE ANNUAL
- 26 BUDGET BILL UNDER SUBSECTIONS (E)(10) AND (G) OF THIS SECTION ARE
- 27 SUPPLEMENTAL TO AND ARE NOT INTENDED TO TAKE THE PLACE OF FUNDING THAT
- 28 OTHERWISE WOULD BE APPROPRIATED FOR THOSE PURPOSES.
- 29 (I) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 EACH YEAR, THE UNIVERSITY OF
- 30 MARYLAND BALTIMORE COUNTY, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT AND
- 31 THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT ON THE OPERATION

- 1 AND PERFORMANCE OF THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN
- 2 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL
- 3 ASSEMBLY.
- 4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
- 5 1, 2022.
