- 2 (A) A SALE OR OFFER FOR SALE OF ESSENTIAL GOODS AND SERVICES IN 3 VIOLATION OF § 14–1302 OF THIS SUBTITLE IS:
- 4 (1) AN UNFAIR, ABUSIVE, OR DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICE, AS 5 DEFINED UNDER TITLE 13 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE; AND
- 6 (2) SUBJECT TO THE ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTY PROVISIONS OF TITLE 13 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE, EXCEPT FOR THE CRIMINAL PENALTIES IN § 13–411 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE.

- THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL ESTABLISH A SYSTEM BY WHICH A PERSON MAY REGISTER TO RECEIVE ELECTRONIC NOTIFICATIONS STATING:
- 17 (1) THAT A STATE OF EMERGENCY HAS BEEN DECLARED AND AN 18 EXECUTIVE ORDER HAS BEEN ISSUED;
- 19 (2) THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE ARE IN EFFECT; AND
- 20 (3) THE CATEGORIES OF ESSENTIAL GOODS AND SERVICES OR 21 INDIVIDUAL ESSENTIAL GOODS AND SERVICES THAT ARE COVERED BY THE 22 EXECUTIVE ORDER.
