A BILL

To amend the Elder Abuse Prevention and Prosecution Act to authorize the Elder Justice Initiative, to require that online resources of such initiative are made available in Spanish, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-				
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,				
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.				
4	This Act may be cited as the "Elder Abuse Protection				
5	Act of 2021".				
6	SEC. 2. ELDER JUSTICE INITIATIVE.				
7	Section 101(b) of the Elder Abuse Prevention and				
8	Prosecution Act (34 U.S.C. 21711(b)) is amended to read				
9	as follows:				
10	"(b) Elder Justice Initiative.—				
11	"(1) Permanent initiative.—The Attorney				
12	General shall establish an Elder Justice Initiative to				
13	coordinate criminal enforcement and public engage-				
14	ment efforts to combat elder abuse, neglect, and finan-				
15	cial fraud and scams that target elders, and to sup-				
16	port and coordinate the efforts of the Elder Justice				
17	Coordinator designated under subsection (a).				
18	"(2) Department of justice elder justice				
19	COORDINATOR.—The Attorney General shall designate				
20	an Elder Justice Coordinator within the Department				
21	of Justice who, in addition to any other responsibil-				
22	ities, shall be responsible for—				
23	"(A) coordinating and supporting the law				
24	enforcement efforts and policy activities as the				

1	head of the Elder Justice Initiative for the De-					
2	partment of Justice on elder justice issues;					
3	"(B) evaluating training models to deter-					
4	mine best practices and creating or compiling					
5	and making publicly available replication guides					
6	and training materials for law enforcement offi-					
7	cers, prosecutors, judges, emergency responders,					
8	individuals working in victim services, adult					
9	protective services, social services, and public					
10	safety, medical personnel, mental health per-					
11	sonnel, financial services personnel, and any					
12	other individuals whose work may bring them in					
13	contact with elder abuse regarding how to—					
14	"(i) conduct investigations in elder					
15	abuse cases;					
16	"(ii) address evidentiary issues and					
17	other legal issues; and					
18	"(iii) appropriately assess, respond to,					
19	and interact with victims and witnesses in					
20	elder abuse cases, including in administra-					
21	tive, civil, and criminal judicial pro-					
22	ceedings; and					
23	"(C) carrying out such other duties as the					
24	Attorney General determines necessary in con-					
25	nection with enhancing the understanding, pre-					

- vention, and detection of, and response to, elder
 abuse.
- 3 "(3) Online public resources.—The Elder
 4 Justice Initiative shall maintain and publish on the
 5 internet, information aimed at protecting elders from
 6 fraudulent schemes and contain resources aimed at
 7 preventing elder abuse.
 - "(4) TELEPHONE HOTLINE.—The Attorney General, in consultation with the Elder Justice Coordinator and the Office of Victims of Crime, shall establish a national elder fraud telephone hotline to provide support to victims and resources to help victims, including referrals to federal, local and state law enforcement where appropriate.
 - "(5) Tribal consultation.—The Elder Justice Coordinator shall provide recommendations to the Office of Tribal Justice on a yearly basis on how to address elder abuse and elder fraud that takes place on federally recognized tribal reservations.
 - "(6) Legal AID.—The Elder Justice Coordinator shall consult with components of the Department of Justice to promote the provision of civil legal aid to victims of elder abuse and elder fraud.
- "(7) SPANISH LANGUAGE RESOURCES.—The Attorney General shall ensure that Elder Justice Initia-

1	tive online resources are available in Spanish and
2	link linguistically appropriate resources to inform
3	Spanish-speaking elders of Federal and State re-
4	sources to combat fraud and abuse that targets the el-
5	derly, to include—
6	"(A) Spanish-language resources and links
7	that help report instances of elder fraud and
8	abuse to State and local law enforcement; and
9	"(B) resources that help prevent financial
10	exploitation of elders.".
