54	(c) "Student learning English" means a student, currently enrolled at a public elementary
55	or secondary educational institution, whose most recent score on an English language
56	proficiency assessment is a 1 or 2.
57	(2)(a) A school district may submit an application to the state board to receive
58	emergency funding if enrollment, at a school within the school district, of students
59	learning English increases by 50% or more above the previous three-year average
60	enrollment for students learning English in the school.

62	(i) demonstrate substantial need for the emergency funding;
63	(ii) include the percentage by which the school's student learning English enrollment
64	exceeds the previous three-year average for the school; and

67	(3) The state board shall:
68	(a) establish and oversee the application process to award emergency funding; and
69	(b) prioritize applications and distribute funding based on:
70	(i) the greatest percentage increase in students learning English enrollment in the

72	(ii) the severity of the financial need of the school.
73	(4)(a) The state board shall draw the emergency funding described in Subsection (2)(a)
74	from the program funds.
75	(b) The state board may not draw program funds of more than \$5,000,000, per fiscal
76	year, for the emergency funding described in this section.
77	Section 3. Effective Date.
78	This bill takes effect on May 7, 2025.
