A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore County – Career Exploration and Development Activities in Public**
3 **High Schools – Prohibiting a Ban or Regulation of Sale of Coffee**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting an Executive Branch agency from banning or regulating
5 the sale of coffee in conjunction with a career exploration and development activity
6 in any public high school in Baltimore County; repealing a certain exception that
7 prohibited banning or regulating the sale of coffee in a Baltimore County public high
8 school that sold coffee on or before a certain date in conjunction with a certain
9 activity; and generally relating to the sale of coffee in conjunction with a career
10 exploration and development activity in a public high school in Baltimore County.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Education**

19 7–423.1.

20 (a) This section applies only in Baltimore County.

21 (b) [Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, an] **AN** Executive Branch
22 agency may **NOT** ban or regulate the sale of coffee in conjunction with a career exploration
23 and development activity in a public high school.

1 [(c) An Executive Branch agency may not ban or regulate the sale of coffee in
2 conjunction with a career exploration and development activity in a public high school that
3 sold coffee on or before June 30, 2018.]

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
5 1, 2021.
