A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to authorize grants for increasing seasonal influenza vaccination rates, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Protecting Americans
- 5 from Seasonal Influenza Act of 2020".
