12 13	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 (A) [One] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, ONE 17 spouse is not competent to disclose any confidential communication between the spouses 18 occurring during their marriage.
- 19 **(B) (1)** A SPOUSE, WHO IS THE ALLEGED VICTIM, IS COMPETENT TO 20 DISCLOSE A CONFIDENTIAL COMMUNICATION BETWEEN SPOUSES OCCURRING 21 DURING THEIR MARRIAGE IN A CRIMINAL ACTION IN WHICH ONE SPOUSE IS 22 CHARGED WITH A CRIME AGAINST THE OTHER SPOUSE.

- 1 (2) A SPOUSE MAY NOT BE COMPELLED TO TESTIFY TO A 2 CONFIDENTIAL COMMUNICATION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- 3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4 October 1, 2024.
