# H. R. 3083

To amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to provide for the preparation of career and technical education teachers.

### IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. Mooney of West Virginia (for himself, Ms. Clark of Massachusetts, Mr. MacArthur, Mr. Langevin, Mr. Blum, and Mr. Bera) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce

## A BILL

- To amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to provide for the preparation of career and technical education teachers.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Technical Education
  - 5 And Career Help (TEACH) Act".

"(1) In General.—An eligible partnership that receives a grant under this section to carry out a program for the preparation of career and technical education teachers shall establish an effective secondary school career and technical education teacher preparation program that shall be—

"(A) available to mid-career professionals or recent graduates of an institution of higher education, who have expertise in a program area in which a skilled career and technical education teacher shortage has been identified through a needs assessment described in paragraph (2);

"(B) an opportunity for program participants to obtain initial licensure based on State requirements and the basic skills required for entry into the education profession, and the option of earning a bachelor's degree or a master's degree; and

"(C) an opportunity for program participants who are current educators and who do not have subject matter expertise in a career and technical education field identified through the needs assessment under paragraph (2) to receive technical skills training to be able to ef-

| 22 | "(i) Application.—Each eligible in-      |

| 24 | who desires to participate in the career |
| 25 | and technical education teacher prepara- |

tion program under this subsection shall submit an application to the eligible partnership.

#### "(ii) Selection.—

"(I) IN GENERAL.—Each eligible partnership shall select applicants for participation in the career and technical education teacher preparation program based on the career and technical education program needs of any high-need local educational agencies in the partnership.

"(II) REQUIREMENT FOR VA-CANT POSITIONS.—Any vacant career and technical educator positions or positions with a demonstrated connection to the needs assessment described in paragraph (2) within the high-need local educational agency in an eligible partnership that receives a grant under this section to carry out a program for the preparation of career and technical education teachers shall be filled with career and technical

| 19 | classroom instruction.                             |

| 22 | quirements in the State in which the partner-      |
| 23 | ship operates, prior to entering the classroom.    |
| 24 | "(D) Literacy training for incorporating           |
| 25 | technical texts into the classroom.                |

| 18 | nical education courses and standards for    |
| 19 | college and career into career and technical |
| 20 | education courses;                           |
| 21 | "(viii) are able to effectively partici-     |
| 22 | pate as a member of an individualized edu-   |
| 23 | cation program team, as defined in section   |
| 24 | 614(d)(1)(B) of the Individuals with Dis-    |
| 25 | abilities Education Act; and                 |

"(ix) are able to successfully employ
effective strategies for literacy instruction
in technical coursework.

### "(6) AGREEMENT TO SERVE.—

"(A) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subparagraph (B), each career and technical education teacher preparation program carried out under this subsection shall require program participants to serve as a full-time career and technical education teacher in a high-need local educational agency that is a part of the eligible partnership for a total of not less than 3 academic years immediately after successfully completing the pre-classroom training program component.

"(B) SERVING LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES OUTSIDE OF THE PARTNERSHIP.—If there are no full-time career and technical education teacher positions in a high-need local educational agency that is a part of the eligible partnership, a program participant may fulfill the service requirement under subparagraph (A) through serving as a full-time career and technical education teacher in a high-need local

| 3  | "(C) CERTIFICATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—                |
| 4  | A program participant under this subsection       |
| 5  | shall provide the eligible partnership with cer-  |
| 6  | tification of the employment that is required     |
| 7  | under this paragraph.                             |
| 8  | "(7) Stipends or salaries; applications           |
| 9  | REPAYMENTS.—                                      |
| 10 | "(A) Stipends or salaries.—A career               |
| 11 | and technical education teacher preparation       |
| 12 | program under this subsection shall provide a     |
| 13 | one-year living stipend or salary to program      |
| 14 | participants during the pre-classroom training    |
| 15 | program component.                                |
| 16 | "(B) Applications for stipends of                 |
| 17 | SALARIES.—Each career and technical edu-          |
| 18 | cation teacher preparation program participant    |
| 19 | desiring a stipend or salary during the pre-      |
| 20 | classroom training program component shall        |
| 21 | submit an application to the eligible partnership |
| 22 | at such time, and containing such information     |
| 23 | and assurances, as the eligible partnership may   |
| 24 | require.  |
| 25 | "(C) Repayments.—                                 |

rying out a career and technical education teacher preparation program under this subsection shall require a recipient of a stipend or salary under subparagraph (A) who does not complete, or who notifies the partnership that the recipient intends not to complete, the service obligation required by paragraph (6) to repay such stipend or salary to the eligible partnership, together with interest, at a rate specified by the partnership in the agreement, and in accordance with such other terms and conditions specified by the eligible partnership, as necessary.

"(ii) OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS.—Any other terms and conditions specified by the eligible partnership may include reasonable provisions for pro rata repayment of the stipend or salary described in subparagraph (A) or for deferral of a program participant's service obligation required by paragraph (6), on grounds of health, incapacitation, inability to secure employment as a full-time career and tech-

| 5  | "(iii) USE OF REPAYMENTS.—An eli-                |
| 6  | gible partnership shall use any repayment        |
| 7  | received under this subparagraph to carry        |
| 8  | out additional activities that are consistent    |
| 9  | with the purposes of this subsection.            |
| 10 | "(8) Reports; parents right-to-know; de-         |
| 11 | VELOPMENT OF PERFORMANCE MEASURES.—              |
| 12 | "(A) Annual report.—An eligible part-            |
| 13 | nership that receives a grant under this section |
| 14 | to carry out a program for the preparation of    |
| 15 | career and technical education teachers shall    |
| 16 | submit to the Secretary and make publicly        |
| 17 | available, at such time and in such manner as    |
| 18 | the Secretary may require, an annual report      |
| 19 | that includes—                                   |
| 20 | "(i) data on the eligible partnership's          |
| 21 | progress on the performance measures de-         |
| 22 | scribed in section 204(a); and                   |
| 23 | "(ii) a description of the challenges            |
| 24 | the eligible partnership has faced in imple-     |
| 25 | menting the grant and how the eligible           |

1 partnership has addressed or plans to ad-2 dress such challenges. "(B) PUBLICLY AVAILABLE.—Each eligible 3 4 partnership that receives a grant under this 5 section to carry out a program for the prepara-6 tion of career and technical education teachers 7 shall complete and make publicly available, not later than 90 days after the grant period for 8 9 such eligible partnership ends, an evaluation 10 based on the evaluation plan described in sec-11 tion 204(a). 12 "(C) PARENTS RIGHT-TO-KNOW.—At the beginning of each school year, a high-need local 13 14 educational agency that receives funds under 15 this subsection shall— "(i) notify the parents of each student 16 17 attending any school receiving funds under 18 this subsection that the parents may re-19 quest, and the agency will provide the par-20 ents on request (and in a timely manner), described 21 the information in section 22 1111(h)(6)(A) of the Elementary and Sec-23 ondary Education Act of 1965; and

| 1 | "(ii) provide to each such parent the       |

"(D) DEVELOPMENT OF PERFORMANCE MEASURES.—The Secretary shall develop performance measures prior to awarding grants under this section, with input and consultation of schools of education, school administrators, teachers, professional nonprofit technical and career organizations, and the opportunity for a 60-day public comment period. The Secretary shall ensure that such measures are made available to potential applicants prior to seeking applications for such grants."

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
