15	RESOURCES.

17	(a)	for a procurement solicitation for a contract that the department anticipates will cost at least		
18	\$250,000 \$200,000 over the life of the contract:			
19	(i)	the name of each purchasing agency issuing the solicitation;		
20	(ii)	what the purchasing agency intends to procure through the solicitation;

22	(iii)	the portion of the purchasing agency's appropriation that it intends to use to pay the vendor;		
23	(iv) (III)	the closing date of the solicitation; and
