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HOUSE BILL DRH40600-NHa-172

Short Title: Diabetes Education for Parents.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO REQUIRE PUBLIC SCHOOL UNITS TO PROVIDE INFORMATION ABOUT
DIABETES TO PARENTS AND LEGAL GUARDIANS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Article 7B of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by
adding a new Part to read:

"Part 7. Health and Safety Requirements.

"§ 115C-77. Diabetes information.

The governing body of a public school unit shall ensure that each school provides parents
and legal guardians with information about type 1 and type 2 diabetes at the beginning of every
school year. This information shall include all of the following:

- (1) A description of type 1 and type 2 diabetes.
- (2) A description of the risk factors and warning signs associated with type 1 and
type 2 diabetes.
- (3) A recommendation that if a student is displaying warning signs associated
with diabetes, the parent or guardian of the student shall consult with the
primary care provider of the student to determine if immediate screening for
diabetes is appropriate.
- (4) A description of the screening process for and stages of diabetes.
- (5) A recommendation that if a student receives a diabetes diagnosis, the parents
or guardians of the student should consult with the primary care provider of
the student to develop an appropriate treatment plan.
- (6) Notification that the school is required to assist students with diabetes in
accordance with the rules adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant
to G.S. 115C-12(31)."

SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
Public Instruction the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) in nonrecurring funds for the
2024-2025 fiscal year to assist the Department in developing and distributing guidance to public
school units on implementing the provisions of this act.

SECTION 3. The act becomes effective July 1, 2024, and applies beginning with the
2024-2025 school year.
