## Tax Sales - Alternative Collection Programs

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a county or municipal corporation to withhold from tax sale property that meets objective criteria established by law by the governing body of 4 5 the county or municipal corporation; repealing the termination date of the authority 6 of a county or municipal corporation to withhold from tax sale owner-occupied 7 residential property; authorizing a county or municipal corporation to withhold from tax sale a residential property or a property owned by a nonprofit organization that 8 9 is enrolled in a payment program established by law by the governing body of the 10 county or municipal corporation; authorizing a county or municipal corporation to 11 cancel or postpone a tax sale during a state of emergency; and generally relating to 12 the tax sales of property.
