The school shall 1046 use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1047 in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1048 developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1049 the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1050 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1051 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1052 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1053 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1054 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1055 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1056 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1057 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1058 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1059 services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1060 organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1061 subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1062 shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1063 purpose. 1064
