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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.519 of the Revised Code to create the 2  
"Purdue University" license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.519 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 8  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 9  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 10  
in division (B) of this section. 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 12  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 13

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 14  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 15  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 16  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 17  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20  
other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28  
other money in that fund. 29

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40  
directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 42  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 43  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 44  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 45  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 47  
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 48

Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 49  
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 50  
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 52  
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 53  
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 54  
its research and other programs. 55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56  
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57  
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58  
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 60  
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 61  
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 62  
contributions for its research and other programs. 63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 65  
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 66  
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 67  
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70  
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71  
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72  
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74  
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76  
contributions into its general account to be used for 77

educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78  
America foundation. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87  
scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92  
that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 99  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 100  
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 101  
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 102  
programming. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104  
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 105  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 106

organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 107  
need. 108

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 109  
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 110  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 111  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 112

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 113  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 114  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 115  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 116  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 117  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 118  
scholarship fund. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 120  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 121  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 122  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 123  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 124  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 125  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 126  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 127  
funds as provided in this section. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 130  
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 131  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 132  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 133  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 134  
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 135  
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 136

funds as provided in this section. 137

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 138  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 139  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 140  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 141  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 142  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 143  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 144  
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 145  
funds as provided in this section. 146

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 147  
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 148  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 149  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151  
receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code to 152  
Purdue university in West Lafayette, Indiana, for purposes of 153  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 154  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 155  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 156  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with 157  
Purdue university to effectuate the distribution of such funds 158  
as provided in this section. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 161  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 162  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 163  
cyclists of all ages. 164

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 165

receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 166  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 167  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 168  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 169  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 170  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 171

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 172  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 173  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 174  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 175  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 176

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 177  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 178  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 179  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 180  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 181

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 182  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 183  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 184  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 185  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 186  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 187  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 188  
sponsors within this state. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 190  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 191  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 192  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 193  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 194  
activities. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and the improvement of patient outcomes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state, to assist that organization in paying for the charitable activities and programs it sponsors in support of United States military personnel, veterans, and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions

into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 226  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 227  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 228  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 229  
destination. 230

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 231  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 232  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 233  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 234  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 235

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 236  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 237  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 238  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 239  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 240  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 241  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 242  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 243  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 244  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 245  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 246

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 247  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 248  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 249

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 250  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 251  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 252  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 253  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 254  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 255

charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 256  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 257  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 258  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 259  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 260  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 261  
under this section. 262

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 263  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 264  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 265  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 266  
programs. 267

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 268  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 269  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 270  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 271

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 272  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 273  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 274  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 275  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 276

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 277  
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 278  
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 279  
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 280  
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 281  
the person who paid the contribution resides. 282

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 283  
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 284

state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 285  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 286  
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 287  
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 288  
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 289  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 290  
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 291  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 292  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 293  
such payments are to be made. 294

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 295  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 296  
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 297  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 298  
river watershed. 299

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 300  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 301  
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 302  
nature preserve. 303

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 304  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 305  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 306  
the money in support of the park. 307

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 308  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 309  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 310  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 312  
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 313

girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 314  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316  
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 317  
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 318  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 319  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 320  
local beekeeping programs. 321

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 322  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 323  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 324  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 325  
legends to inspire future leaders. 326

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 327  
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 328  
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 329  
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 330  
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 331  
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 332  
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 335  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 336  
the contributions for educational purposes. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 338  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 339  
Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 340  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 341

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 342

pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 343  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 344  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 345  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 346  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 347  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 348  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 349

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 350  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 351  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 352  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 353  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 354  
(G) of that section. 355

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 356  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 357  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 358  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 359  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 360  
Ohio and for educational programs. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 362  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 363  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 364  
supporting cancer research. 365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 366  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 367  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 369  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 370  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 371

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 372  
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 373  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 374  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 375  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 376

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 377  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 378  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 379  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 380  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 381

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 382  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 383  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 384  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 385  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 386  
scouts. 387

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 388  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 389  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 390  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 391  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 393  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 394  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 395  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 397  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 398  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 399  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 400

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 401  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 402  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 403  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 404  
charitable purposes. 405

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 406  
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 407  
Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose. 408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 409  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 410  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 411  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 412  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 415  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 416  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 417  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 418  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 419  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 420

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 421  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 422  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 423  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 424  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 425  
in the line of duty. 426

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 427  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 428  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 429

contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 430  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 431

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 432  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 433  
association of chiefs of police. 434

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 435  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 436  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 437  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 438  
families. 439

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 440  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 441  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 442  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 443

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 444  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 445  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 446  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 447  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 448  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 449  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 450  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 451  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 452  
participating in that program. 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 454  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 455  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 456  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 457

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 458

receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 459  
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 460  
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 461  
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 462

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 463  
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 464  
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 465  
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 466  
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 467  
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 468  
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 469  
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 470  
lives to the fullest. 471

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 472  
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 473  
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 474  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 475  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 476

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 477  
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 478  
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 479  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 480  
Cleveland, Ohio. 481

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 482  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 483  
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 484  
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 485  
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 486  
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 487  
resides. 488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 489

emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 1004  
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 1005  
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 1006  
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 1007  
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1008  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1009  
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1010  
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1011  
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1012  
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1013  
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1014  
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1015  
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1016  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1017  
purpose. 1018

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1019  
receives pursuant to section 4503.954 of the Revised Code to 1020  
University school located in the suburban area near the 1021  
municipal corporation of Cleveland. The school shall use fifty 1022  
per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition 1023  
assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining 1024  
fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing 1025  
services to the school's students that assist in developing or 1026  
maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. 1027  
The services provided may include bereavement counseling, 1028  
instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity 1029  
training, and the counseling and education of students regarding 1030  
bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and 1031  
human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the 1032  
school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to 1033

receive training in providing those services. The school 1034  
principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate 1035

Saint Albert the Great school located in North Royalton. The 1044  
school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives 1045  
to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall 1046  
use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1047  
in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1048  
developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1049  
the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1050  
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1051  
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1052  
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1053  
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1054  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1055

receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to 1071  
John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school 1072  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any political 1073  
purpose. 1074

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1075  
receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1076  
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1077  
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1078  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1079  
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1080  
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1081  
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1082

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1083  
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1084  
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1085  
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1086  
contributions for any political purpose. 1087

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1088  
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1089  
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1090  
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1091  
any political purpose. 1092

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1093

receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1094  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1095  
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1096  
purpose. 1097

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1098  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1099  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1100  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1101  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1102

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1103  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1104  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1105  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1106  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1107

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1108  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1109  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1110  
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1111  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1112  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1113  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1114  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1115

**Sec. 4503.519.** (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1116  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1117  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1118  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1119  
and issuance of "Purdue University" license plates. The 1120  
application may be combined with a request for a special 1121  
reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1122  
Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1123

compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1124  
section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1125  
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Purdue 1126  
University" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 1127  
validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 1128  
the Revised Code. 1129

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1130  
inscribed on the license plates, "Purdue University" license 1131  
plates shall display an appropriate logo and words, selected by 1132  
representatives of Purdue university and approved by the 1133  
registrar. "Purdue University" license plates shall display 1134  
county identification stickers that identify the county of 1135  
registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 1136  
Code. 1137

(B) "Purdue University" license plates and a validation 1138  
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 1139  
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 1140  
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 1141  
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1142  
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1143  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1144  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1145  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1146  
provided in division (C) (1) of this section; and compliance with 1147  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1148  
vehicles. 1149

(C) (1) For each application for registration and 1150  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1151  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of thirty 1152  
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1153

state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1154  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1155

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1156  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1157  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1158  
of "Purdue University" license plates, into the state treasury 1159  
to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund 1160  
created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1161

**Section 2.** That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 1162  
Code is hereby repealed. 1163
